Findings: Children in care shall be protected from any items and conditions which threaten their health, safety, and well-being. During the inspection, it was determined the program did not protect children from an unsafe item or condition or equipment due to the following number 18 below:

- 1. Pull cord(s) on the window blind(s).
- 2. Extension cord(s); electrical cord(s) attached to an object that could result in a severe injury if pulled.
- 3. Stacked tables.
- 4. Folding tables.

Code: The program is required to respond to all non-compliances by the date noted in the inspection report.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the program had not responded to the non-compliances addressed in the inspection report dated 11/3/2023, Inspection #255468. The rule requires the program complete and submit a corrective action plan in OCLQS to address non-compliances detailed in written inspection reports within the timeframe outlined in the report. Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the handwashing requirements were not being followed by the provider, program staff, residents, or a child in that handwashing was not completed during diaper changing and before lunch was prepared nor eaten. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-13-13 Clean environment and equipment

Code: The program is required to follow the cleaning schedule for equipment.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program was not providing a clean and healthy environment, furniture, materials and equipment as required by Appendix A, as noted in numbers 9 and 29 below:

- 1. Item(s) soiled with blood or bodily fluids were not cleaned/sanitized immediately.
- 2. Blankets/sheets were not cleaned weekly, when soiled, or before use by another child.
- 3. Children's individual blankets and belongings were stored in an unsanitary manner.
- 4. Bottles, bottle caps, nipples and other equipment used for bottle feeding were not cleaned and sanitized in a dishwasher or by washing, rinsing, and boiling for one minute.
- 5. Carpets were not vacuumed weekly or cleaned when soiled.
- 6. Changing table/pad was not sanitized after each use or cleaned when visibly soiled.
- 7. Reusable cloths were not being washed daily or when visibly soiled.
- 8. Cots/Pads/Mats were not cleaned and sanitized before assigning to a different child, when used by a sick child, when soiled or at least every three months.

- 9. Cribs were not cleaned and sanitized monthly, or when soiled, or before use by another child.
- 10. Diaper Receptacles were not cleaned and sanitized daily or more frequently as needed to eliminate odor.
- 11. Dishes/Cups/Silverware were not cleaned and sanitized after each use.
- 12. Water Containers were not labeled with the child's name, or were not cleaned and sanitized before use again on another day.
- 13. Dress up clothes and hats (dramatic play) were not cleaned monthly or when soiled.
- 14. Floors were not cleaned weekly or when soiled.
- 15. The food prep area, including sinks, were not cleaned before and after preparing food (including bottle preparation) or between preparing raw or cooked food.
- 16. Potty chairs were not cleaned after each use, rinsed with water, cleaned and sanitized or contents were not emptied into a toilet.
- 17. Food tables, highchair trays were not cleaned before and after each use.
- 18. Tables used for play were not cleaned when visibly soiled or sanitized daily.
- 19. Toilet bowls were not cleaned when visibly soiled or sanitized weekly.
- 20. Toilet seat(s), handle(s) and hand washing sink(s) were not cleaned when visibly soiled or sanitized daily.
- 21. Mouthed toys were not cleaned and sanitized after each child's use.
- 22. Toys, other than those mouthed by children, were not cleaned monthly or when visibly soiled.
- 23. Washable furniture, including fabrics on infant equipment, were not cleaned weekly or when soiled.
- 24. Upholstered furniture was not steam cleaned when soiled.
- 25. Slip covers were not washed at least every six months or when soiled.
- 26. Wastebaskets/rinse buckets, including lids, were not being emptied daily or cleaned and sanitized when visibly soiled.
- 27. The manufacturer's directions for the cleaning product were not followed.
- 28. The solution used for sanitizing was not a commercial product registered by the United States Environmental Protection Agency as a sanitizer.
- 29. Other: Soiled food plastic materials were surrounding the child care space; the floor, window space and shelves.

Furniture, materials and equipment must be maintained according to the cleaning and sanitizing schedule in Appendix A to this rule. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-13-13 Clean environment and equipment

Code: The program is required to have all required items in the restroom(s) and keep them sanitary.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that unsanitary conditions, as noted in the following number 3 below, were in the child care restroom:

- 1. There was no liquid soap.
- 2. There was no toilet tissue.
- 3. There were no individually assigned towels or disposable towels.
- 4. The toilet cleaning brush was accessible to the children.

- 5. The plunger was accessible to the children.
- 6. The toilet was not flushed.
- 7. The trash was not emptied from the day before.
- 8. There was a strong urine odor.
- 9. Other [].

The restroom(s) must be kept sanitary at all times. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Code: The program is required to store cleaning and sanitizing supplies in a place that is inaccessible to children. Cleaning agents, aerosol cans and chemical substances must be stored in their original container or clearly labeled. School-age children may use cleaning supplies and equipment with adult supervision.

Findings: During the inspection, cleaning and sanitizing equipment and supplies were not used or stored properly as noted in number 2 below:

- 1. Cosmetics were accessible to children in the [] area.
- 2. Disinfecting wipes were accessible to children in the child care authorized space area.
- 3. Fish food was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 4. Hand lotion was accessible to children in the [] area.

- 11. Other potentially hazardous substance [] was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 12. Cleaning/sanitizing supplies had not been clearly labeled.
- 13. School-age children were using cleaning supplies, agents and/or equipment without adult supervision.
- 14. A spray aerosol was used in the [] group while children were in attendance.
- 15. Other: [].

Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that the potentially hazardous substance is no longer accessible to children and a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the requirements for the JFS 01242 "Medical, Dental and General Emergency Plan" were not followed as noted in number 1 below:

- 1. The plan was not posted on each level of the home used for child care.
- 2. The name, address and telephone number of the program were not complete.
- 3. The location of the first aid kit, fire extinguisher and fire alarm system, fire alarm pull stations and electrical circuit box were not complete.
- 4. The telephone number for emergency squad, fire department hospital, poison control program, public children services agency, local health department, local emergency management agency and police department were not complete.
- 5. Location of children's records was not complete.
- 6. Emergency information including any medications or supplies needed i the event of an evacuation was not complete.
- 7. The current version of the prescribed form was not used.
- 8. The plan was not implemented when necessary in that [].

Code: The program is required to post the completed JFS 01201 "Dental First Aid" and implement as required by

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the JFS 01201 "Dental First Aid" was not posted on each level of the home. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Code: The program staff is required to protect the children from hazardous conditions in the outdoor play area.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the following hazardous conditions existed in the outdoor play area, as noted in number 15 below:

- 1. There was broken glass.
- 2. There were tall weeds.
- 3. There was poison ivy.
- 4. There were tree branches.
- 5. There was mold visible.
- 6. The sandbox was contaminated.
- 7. There were thistles with prickers.
- 8. There were bird droppings.
- 9. The outdoor area was littered with trash.
- 10. The trash can was missing a lid.
- 11. The trash was not emptied from the day(s) before.
- 12. The trash can was overflowing with trash.
- 13. The trash can was infested with insects.
- 14. The trash can was visibly dirty.
- 15. Other; The city trash cans were accessible to children in the authorized outdoor space. Additionally, a fire pit was accessible to children.

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Rule: 5101:2-13-22 Meals and Snacks



Code: The program is required to post the current menu in a noticeable location that is accessible to parents and note any substitutions at the time of the change.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program's weekly menu did not meet the requirement as noted in number 1 below.

- 1. The menu was not posted.
- 2. The posted menu was not in a visible place readily accessible to parents.
- 3. The menu was not currently dated.
- 4. The entire menu was substituted.
- 5. At least one item on menu did not match what was served.
- 6. The meal or snack served did not match the posted menu.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Code: The program is required to have a completed emergency preparedness and response plan.

- 5. Emergency or disaster evacuations due to hazardous materials and spills, gas leaks or bomb threats including a designated safe site where staff and children can safely remain when evacuated
- 6. Outbreaks, epidemics or other infectious disease emergencies
- 7. Loss of power, water, or heat
- 8. Other threatening situations that may pose a health or safety hazard to the children in the program Details:
- 9. Shelter in place or evacuation, how the program will care for and account for the children until they can be reunited with the parent
- 10. Assisting infants, toddlers and children with special needs and/or health conditions
- 11. Emergency contact information for parents and the program
- 12. Procedures for notifying and communicating with parents regarding the location of the children if evacuated
- 13. Procedures for communicating with parents during loss of communications, no phone or internet service available

- 14. The location of supplies and procedures for gathering necessary supplies for staff and children if required to shelter in place
- 15. What to do if a disaster occurs during the transport of children or when on a field trip or routine trip
- 16. Making the plan available to all child care staff members and employees
- 17. Training of staff or reassignment of staff duties as appropriate
- 18. Updating the plan on a yearly basis
- 19. Contact with local emergency management officials
- 20. The plan was unable to be implemented in that, [].

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes the missing information, if applicable, to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-13-16 First Aid Kit/Standard Precautions

Code: The program is required to meet the requirements for first aid kits.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program did not have a first aid kit onsite as required, that included all items listed in the appendix A of the rule. The kit was missing the items listed in numbers 8, 9 and 12 below:

- 1. One roll of first-aid tape;
- 2. Individually wrapped sterile gauze;

squares in assorted sizes;

- 3. Sterile adhesive bandages in assorted sizes;
- 4.Tweezers;
- 5. Gauze rolled bandage;
- 6. Triangular bandage;
- 7. Rounded end scissors;
- 8. Tooth preservation system or fresh chilled liquid milk in which to transport a lost permanent tooth, including a written reference indicating location of the refrigerator/freezer where milk is stored if a tooth preservation system is not part of the first aid kit (for programs serving school age children only);
- 9. A working digital thermometer;
- 10. Disposable non-latex gloves;
- 11. A working flashlight;
- 12. An instant cold pack that has not been activated or ice, including a written reference indicating location of the refrigerator/freezer where the ice is stored if an instant cold pack is not part of the first aid kit;
- 13. Sealable leak-proof plastic bags in assorted sizes or double bagged plastic bags that can be securely tied for materials soiled with blood or bodily fluids;
- 14. Pocket mask or face shield, appropriate; for all ages of children in care, for cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) administration;
- 15. Soap or waterless sanitizer (field trip or transporting away from the program only);
- 16. Bottled water (field trip or transporting away from the program only).

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-13-20 Crib and Playpen Requirements

Code: The program is required to remove objects from cribs/playpens that could block the child.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that a child had been place in a crib or playpen with the following number 4 below which could obstruct a provider or child care staff member's view of the infant:

- 1. Busy box or other toy attached to the side of the crib or playpen.
- 2. A blanket hanging over the side of the crib or playpen.
- 3. Stuffed animal that is not large/soft enough that it could conform to the shape of the child's face.
- 4. Other: Food trash, pillow(s), full size blankets used and left inside pack-n-plays.

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

- 1. The provider had not created or updated their individual profile in the OPR.
- 2. The provider had not created or updated the program's organizational dashboard in the OPR.
- 3. At least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member had not created or updated their individual profile in the OPR.
- 4. At least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member had not created an employment record in the OPR for the program on or before the first day of employment, including date of hire.
- 5. At least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member had not updated changes to positions or roles in the OPR within five calendar days of the change.
- 6. The program's organizational dashboard in the OPR was not updated within five business days when at least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member's scheduled days and hours changed.
- 7. The program's organizational dashboard in the OPR was not updated within five business days when at least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member's group assignments changed, if applicable.
- 8. The program's organizational dashboard in the OPR was not updated with the employment end date within five business days when at least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member ended employment.
- 9. At least one resident over the age of eighteen had not created a profile and employment record for the family child care provider within five days of becoming a resident or turning eighteen.
- 10. The program's organizational dashboard in the OPR was not updated within five calendar days of a change in residency for at least one resident over the age of eighteen.

Code: The program is required to have a completed medical on file for each child.

Findings: In review of of the children's records, it was determined that completed medical statements were not on file, as required, for children listed on the JFS Children's Record Review For Child Care as indicated in number 1 and 8 below:

- 1. No medical was on file for at least one child
- 2. Medical(s) on file was not updated every 13 months
- 3. Medical(s) were missing child's name and date of birth
- 4. Medical(s) were missing the date of the medical examination
- 5. The date of the exam was more than 13 months prior to the date the form was signed
- 6. Medical(s) were missing a statement that the child has been examined and is in suitable condition for participation in group care

- 7. Medical(s) were missing the signature, business address and telephone number of the physician, physician's assistant(PA), advance practice nurse (APN) or certified nurse practitioner (CNP) who examined the child
- 8. Medicals were missing a record of immunizations the child has had specifying month, day and year
- 9. Medical(s) were missing a statement from the physician, PA, APN, or CNP that the child has been immunized or is in the process of being immunized against the diseases
- required by division 5104.014 of the Revised Code and found in appendix A to this rule
