Rule: 5101:2-12-18 Ratio

Code: The program is required to maintain the appropriate staff to child ratio for each group served.

Findings: During the inspection, required staff/child ratios were not maintained for different groups, as noted below:

The ratio determined for the infant group was 1 Child Care Staff Member for 8 children when 3 school-age children were in the room for discipline issues. Additionally, a ratio of 1 Child Care Staff Members for 17 children was determined for the Pre-K group at lunch time and a ratio of 2 Child Care Staff members for 15 toddlers when 2 School-Age children were in the room due to discipline issues.



Additional staff members must be hired or current Child Care Staff Members must be rescheduled to maintain compliance. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Low Risk Non-Compliances

Domain:01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5101:2-12-19 Supervision

Code: The program staff is required to supervise children in their assigned group by sight and hearing. Supervision includes being near enough to respond and reach children immediately including responding to the child's basic needs and protecting them from harm.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that children were not being properly supervised as noted in number 4 below:

1. Children were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during indoor play.

2. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during outdoor play.

3. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member more than once.

4. Staff were not physically present in the space and near enough to respond and reach the child(ren) immediately.

Children must be supervised according to rule and within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member at all times. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
