Complaint Allegations

If a program disagrees with a licensing finding, the program may request a review of the finding(s). Ohio Administrative Code 5101:2-12-03 and 5101:2-13-03 detail the process for submitting a request for review. Domain:02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5180:2-12-13 Sanitary Equipment and Environment

Code: The program is required to follow the cleaning schedule for equipment.

Allegation: The program did not follow the cleaning schedule for equipment.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program was not providing a clean and healthy environment, furniture, materials and equipment as required by Appendix A, as noted in numbers 18 and 24 below:

- 1. Item(s) soiled with blood or bodily fluids were not cleaned/sanitized immediately.
- 2. Blankets/sheets were not cleaned weekly, when soiled, or before use by another child.
- 3. Children's individual blankets and belongings were stored in an unsanitary manner.
- 4. Bottles, bottle caps, nipples and other equipment used for bottle feeding were not cleaned and sanitized in a dishwasher or by washing, rinsing, and boiling for one minute.
- 5. Carpets were not vacuumed weekly or cleaned when soiled.
- 6. Changing table/pad was not sanitized after each use or cleaned when visibly soiled.
- 7. Reusable cloths were not being washed daily or when visibly soiled.
- 8. Cots/Pads/Mats were not cleaned and sanitized before assigning to a different child, when used by a sick child, when soiled or at least every three months.
- 9. Cribs were not cleaned and sanitized monthly, or when soiled, or before use by another child.
- 10. Diaper Receptables were not cleaned and sanitized daily or more frequently as needed to eliminate odor.
- 11. Dishes/Cups/Silverware were not cleaned and sanitized after each use.
- 12. Water Containers were not labeled with the child's name, or were not cleaned and sanitized before use again on another day.
- 13. Dividers were not cleaned when visibly soiled.
- 14. Dress up clothes and hats (dramatic play) were not cleaned monthly or when soiled.
- 15. Floors were not cleaned weekly or when soiled.
- 16. The food prep area, including sinks, were not cleaned before and after preparing food (including bottle preparation) or between preparing raw or cooked food.
- 17. Potty chairs were not cleaned after each use, rinsed with water, cleaned and sanitized or contents were not emptied into a toilet.
- 18. Food tables, highchair trays were not cleaned before and after each use.
- 19. Tables used for play were not cleaned when visibly soiled or sanitized daily.
- 20. Toilet bowls were not cleaned when visibly soiled or sanitized weekly.
- 21. Toilet seat(s), handle(s) and hand washing sink(s) were not cleaned when visibly soiled or sanitized daily.
- 22. Mouthed toys were not cleaned and sanitized after each child's use.
- 23. Toys, other than those mouthed by children, were not cleaned monthly or when visibly soiled.
- 24. Washable furniture, including fabrics on infant equipment, were not cleaned weekly or when soiled. (Including shelves)
- 25. Upholstered furniture was not steam cleaned when soiled.
- 26. Slip covers were not washed at least every six months or when soiled.
- 27. Wastebaskets/rinse buckets, including lids, were not being emptied daily or cleaned and sanitized when visibly soiled.
- 28. The manufacturer's directions for the cleaning product were not followed.
- 29. The solution used for sanitizing was not a commercial product registered by the United States Environmental Protection Agency as a sanitizer.

Domain:02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5180:2-12-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to store chemicals and machinery in a place that is inaccessible to children. The program is required to provide an outdoor play area away from machinery in operation.

Findings: During the inspection, a potentially hazardous item or toxic substance was used or stored in an unlocked closet, on the floor, where children had access to it, as noted in numbers 2 and 9 below.

- 1. Bleach.
- 2. Cleaning agent.
- 3. Fish tank chemicals.
- 4. Gasoline.
- 5. Pesticide.
- 6. Poison, including insect/rodent poison.
