Complaint Allegations

Domain:06 Program Information

Rule: 5180:2-12-14 Transportation and Field Trip Procedures

Code: The program is required to have all adults and children on trips wear seat belts, or use child restraints if required by law. The program is required to have only one child in each seat belt and have all children under 12 years of age sit in the back seats of the vehicle. The program is required to have all children sitting in a seat on the vehicle with a seat belt, as opposed to standing or sitting on the floor.

Allegation: The complainant alleged the program did not follow regulations and/or safety precautions when children were transported.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: "During the inspection, it was determined the program did not follow regulations and/or safety precautions when children were transported as noted in number 2 below:

- 1. Seat belts were not used by children.
- 2. Child restraint systems were not used.
- 3. Children were riding in seats that were not securely anchored.
- 4. More than one child was strapped in a seat belt.
- 5. A child under the age of twelve years old rode in the front seat of the vehicle.
- 6. At least one child or adult was standing or sitting on the floor in a moving vehicle, in that [].
- 7. Adult(s) in the vehicle failed to wear seat belt(s) Provide staff training.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes assurance that these safety guidelines will be met when children are transported, and a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule."

Moderate Risk Non-Compliances

Domain:01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5180:2-12-18 Ratio

Code: The program is required to have a second employee present, and used based on the qualifications they meet, when seven or more children are present.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program did not meet the rule requirement as noted in number 1 below:

- 1. The program did not have a second employee or Child Care Staff Member present when required;
- 2. The program was using a second Child Care Staff Member who was not able to meet this criteria as defined in the rule.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain:01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5180:2-12-18 Ratio

Code: The program is required to maintain the appropriate staff to child ratio for each group served.

Findings: During the inspection, required staff/child ratios were not maintained for the Infant/Toddler group on multiple occasions, as noted below:

The ratio determined for the Infant/Toddler group was 1 Child Care Staff Member(s) for 14 children upon arrival at the program. Additionally, a ratio of 1 Child Care Staff Member(s) for 7 children was determined for the Infant/Toddler group when a second Child Care Staff Member arrived and took part of the group to another room.

Additional staff members must be hired or current Child Care Staff Members must be rescheduled to maintain compliance. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Low Risk Non-Compliances

Domain:01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5180:2-12-18 Group Size

Code: The program is required to maintain the appropriate group size for each group of children served.



Findings: During the inspection, group size limitations were not maintained for the group of children infant-school age as it was determined there were 14 children grouped together. The group size shall not exceed twice the maximum number of children allowed per Child Care Staff Member. Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain:01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5180:2-12-18 Attendance Records

Code: The program is required to maintain a record of the arrival and departure of each child. The program is also required to retain the original attendance record at the center for a period of one year.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the program did not meet the requirements for keeping an attendance record as listed in number(s) 2, 3, 4, 6, and 7 below:

- 1. No attendance record was being maintained.
- 2. The attendance record was not being consistently completed.
- 3. The record did not include the name of at least one child.
- 4. The record did not include the birth date of at least one child.
- 5. The record did not include the assigned group.
- 6. The record did not include the child's weekly schedule.
- 7. The record did not include the time (hours and minutes) of each child's arrival and departure to the program, including transportation by the program.
- 8. The original attendance record was not kept at the program for a period of one year.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 06/29/2025

Domain:01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5180:2-12-18 Attendance Records

Code: The program is required to have a method for tracking the children in each group. The tracking method must be updated throughout the day and kept with the group at all times.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the method for tracking children in each group did not meet the requirements of the rule as noted in number 4 below:

- 1. There was no method in place;
- 2. The method did not include each child's name;
- 3. The method did not include each child's date of birth;
- 4. The tracking method did not remain with the group at all times;
- 5. The tracking method was not updated throughout the day as children entered or left the group.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 06/29/2025



Domain:07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5180:2-12-23 Diapering and Toilet Training

Code: The program staff is required to change wet or soiled diapers immediately.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that a child's basic diapering needs were not being met in number 3 below:

- 1. Diapers were not checked and immediately changed when needed;
- 2. Diapers not checked regularly;
- 3. Diapers not changed when found to be wet or soiled;
- 4. Other [].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
