## **Complaint Allegations**

If a program disagrees with a licensing finding, the program may request a review of the finding(s). Ohio Administrative Code 5101:2-12-03 and 5101:2-13-03 detail the process for submitting a request for review. The request for review must be submitted within seven business days from the receipt of the licensing report. In addition, if the program is star rated, the rating may be impacted if a serious or moderate risk non-compliance is cited.

## Domain:02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5180:2-12-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to provide an environment that protects the children in care from any items and conditions that may threaten their health, safety, and well-being.

Allegation: A staff person had a baby in her arms and the baby tried to get the bottle and pulled the bottle warmer off the counter spilling water on her thigh

**Determination: Substantiated** 

Findings: Children in care shall be protected from any items and conditions which threaten their health, safety, and well-being. During the inspection, it was determined the program did not protect children from an unsafe item, condition or equipment noted in number17below:

- 1. Closed ended pull cord(s) on the window blind(s)
- 2. Extension cord(s); electrical cord(s) attached to an object that could result in a severe injury if pulled.
- 3. Stacked tables.
- 4. Folding tables.
- 5. Matches and/or a lighter.
- 6. Power tool(s).
- 7. Live wires.
- 8. Stove(s) that are either on or able to be turned on by a child.
- 9. Asbestos.
- 10. Traffic.
- 11. A body of water.
- 12. A well.
- 13. Environmental hazard(s) confirmed by local authorities having jurisdiction over the hazard.
- 14. A crockpot used to heat bottles.
- 15. Immediate access to a knife.
- 16. Large or heavy pieces of shelving units are not securely anchored to the wall.
- 17. Other: An infant had access to a bottle warm which ultimately resulted in serious injury.

Any hazardous equipment must be removed, replaced, or repaired and any hazardous condition must be corrected and must be made inaccessible to children. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that the item or condition has been removed and a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
