Domain:01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5180:2-12-19 Supervision

Code: The program staff is required to supervise children in their assigned group by sight and hearing. Supervision includes being near enough to respond and reach children immediately and protecting them from harm.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that children were left unattended while inside the program as noted in number(s) 8 below:

1. Child(ren) were left unattended once.



- 2. Child(ren) were left unattended more than once.
- 3. Child(ren) left the group and were unattended.
- 4. Child care staff were using a baby monitor to supervise children.
- 5. Child care staff were using a walkie talkie to supervise children.
- 6. Child care staff were using mirrors to view children in another room.
- 7. Child care staff were using a video camera instead of physically being present in the room.

8. One child care staff member was attempting to supervise two adjacent classrooms at naptime; however, she was observed dealing with children in the Preschool room who were awake and off their cots, and no staff member was supervising the Pre-K room.

Children must be supervised and within sight and hearing of a child care staff member at all times. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Low Risk Non-Compliances

Domain:01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5180:2-12-20 Cots and Napping

Code: The program is required to provide sufficient lighting when the children rest, nap, or sleep.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the area used when children rest, nap or sleep was not lighted sufficiently to allow child care staff visual supervision of the children at all times. This was observed in the 2 1/2's, Preschool and Pre-K classrooms. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. Submit a written response for this rule noncompliance.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 07/31/2025

Domain:01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5180:2-12-19 Supervision

Code: The program staff is required to supervise children in their assigned group by sight and hearing. Supervision includes being near enough to respond and reach children immediately including responding to the child's basic needs and protecting them from harm.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that children were not being properly supervised as noted in number(s) 1 below in that during naptime, multiple sleeping children were observed with their entire bodies and heads covered by blankets in the 2 1/2's, and Pre K classrooms:

- 1. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during indoor play (naptime).
- 2. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during outdoor play.
- 3. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member more than once.
- 4. Staff were not physically present in the space and near enough to respond and reach the child(ren) immediately.
