Rule: 5101:2-13-03 Inspection Requirements

Code: The program is required to respond to all non-compliances by the date noted in the inspection report.



Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the program had not responded to the non-compliances addressed in the inspection report dated 1/20/23. The rule requires the program complete and submit a corrective action plan in OCLQS to address non-compliances detailed in written inspection reports within the timeframe outlined in the report. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that current and future corrective action plans will be submitted timely, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-13-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to store cleaning and sanitizing supplies in a place that is inaccessible to children. Cleaning agents, aerosol cans and chemical substances must be stored in their original container or clearly labeled. School-age children may use cleaning supplies and equipment with adult supervision.

Findings: During the inspection, cleaning and sanitizing equipment and supplies were not stored properly as noted in numbers 6 & 11 below:

- 1. Cosmetics were accessible to children in the [] area.
- 2. Disinfecting wipes were accessible to children in the [] area.
- 3. Fish food was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 4. Hand lotion was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 5. Hand sanitizer (for children under 24 months) was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 6. Laundry detergent was accessible to children in the dining area.
- 7. Powder dish washing soap was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 8. Paint cans were accessible to children in the [] area.
- 9. White out was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 10. Potting Soil was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 11. Other potentially hazardous substance, conditioner, toothpaste, & prescription oral rinse was accessible to children in the program bathroom area.
- 12. Cleaning/sanitizing supplies had not been clearly labeled.
- 13. School-age children were using cleaning supplies, agents and/or equipment without adult supervision.
- 14. A spray aerosol was used in the [] group while children were in attendance.
- 15. Other: [].

Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that the potentially hazardous substance is no longer accessible to children and a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-13-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to provide an environment that protects the children in care from any items and conditions that may threaten their health, safety, and well-being.

Findings: Children in care shall be protected from any items and conditions which threaten their health, safety, and well being. During the inspection, it was determined that children were not protected from the following condition which may threaten their health, safety, or well being as noted in the following number 1 below:

- 1. Surge protectors/outlets did not have childproof receptacle covers;
- 2. Open pull cords that are not closed loop;

3. Toys or other items small enough to be swallowed were present in the space where infants and/or toddlers were in care;

- 4. Electrical/extension cords attached to an object that would not likely result in a severe injury if pulled;
- 5. Stacked chairs;
- 6. Telephone cords;
- 7. Stacked chairs;
- 8. Employee(s) purse(s);
- 9. Diaper bags;
- 10. Television not securely anchored;
- 11. Small or lightweight pieces of shelving units are not securely anchored to the wall;
- 12. Staff member stepped over a barrier/gate while holding a child;
- 13. Chipping or peeling paint;
- 14. An area rug did not have a nonskid backing;
- 15. An area rug presented a tripping hazard;
- 16. A floor surface was unsafe in that [];
- 17. No platform was provided for the sink or toilet;
- 18. The platform provided for the sink or toilet was not sturdy;
- 19. The platform provided for the sink or toilet posed a safety hazard in that [];
- 20. Emergency exits were blocked by the following furniture in that [];
- 21. A mercury thermometer was being used to take a child's temperature.
- 22. Methods of ventilation used did not provide protection from rodents, insects, or other hazards.
- 23. Other [].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-13-16 First Aid Kit/Standard Precautions

Code: The program is required to meet the requirements for first aid kits.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program did not have a first aid kit onsite as required, that included all items listed in the appendix A of the rule. The kit was missing the item listed in number 7 below:



- 1. One roll of first-aid tape;
- 2. Individually wrapped sterile gauze;
- squares in assorted sizes;
- 3. Sterile adhesive bandages in assorted sizes;
- 4.Tweezers;
- 5. Gauze rolled bandage;
- 6. Triangular bandage;
- 7. Rounded end scissors;

8. Tooth preservation system or fresh chilled liquid milk in which to transport a lost permanent tooth, including a written reference indicating location of the refrigerator/freezer where milk is stored if a tooth preservation system is not part of the first aid kit (for programs serving school age children only);

- 9. A working digital thermometer;
- 10. Disposable non-latex gloves;
- 11. A working flashlight;

12. An instant cold pack that has not been activated or ice, including a written reference indicating location of the refrigerator/freezer where the ice is stored if an instant cold pack is not part of the first aid kit;

13. Sealable leak-proof plastic bags in assorted sizes or double bagged plastic bags that can be securely tied for materials soiled with blood or bodily fluids;

14. Pocket mask or face shield, appropriate; for all ages of children in care, for cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) administration;

- 15. Soap or waterless sanitizer (field trip or transporting away from the program only);
- 16. Bottled water (field trip or transporting away from the program only).

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 08/19/2023

Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-13-16 Disaster Plan

Code: The program is required to have a completed written disaster plan.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the program's written disaster plan did not meet the requirement or was missing the information in numbers 8, 13, 16, & 17 below: Procedures:

- 1. The written disaster plan had not been completed
- 2. The plan was not provided to all child care staff and employees
- 3. Weather emergencies and natural disasters which include severe thunderstorms, tornadoes, flash flooding, major snowfall, blizzards, ice storms or earthquakes

4. Emergency outdoor and indoor lockdown or evacuation due to threats of violence which includes active shooter, bioterrorism or terrorism

- 5. Emergency or disaster evacuations due to hazardous materials and spills, gas leaks or bomb threats.
- 6. Outbreaks, epidemics or other infectious disease emergencies
- 7. Loss of power, water, or heat



8. Other threatening situations that may pose a health or safety hazard to the children in the program

9. Shelter in place or evacuation, how the program will care for and account for the children until they can be
reunited with the parent
10. Assisting infants and children with special needs and/or health conditions
11. Emergency contact information for parents and the program
12. Procedures for notifying and communicating with parents regarding the location of the children if evacuated
13. Procedures for communicating with parents during loss of communications, no phone or internet service
available
14. The location of supplies and procedures for gathering necessary supplies for staff and children if required to
shelter in place
15. What to do if a disaster occurs during the transport of children or when on a field trip or routine trip
16. Making the plan available to all child care staff members and employees
17. Training of staff or reassignment of staff duties as appropriate
18. Updating the plan on a yearly basis
19. Contact with local emergency management officials
