Domain: 01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5101:2-13-18 Attendance

Code: The program is required to maintain a record of the arrival and departure of each child. The program is also required to retain the original attendance record at the center for a period of one year.



Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the program did not meet the requirements for keeping an attendance record as listed in number(s) 4 & 6 below:

1. No attendance record was being maintained.
2. The attendance record was not being consistently completed.
3. The record did not include the name of at least one child.
4. The record did not include the birth date of at least one child. (past weeks missing)
5. The record did not include the assigned group.
6. The record did not include the child's weekly schedule. (current week & some past weeks missing)
7. The record did not include the time (hours and minutes) of each child's arrival and departure to the program, including transportation by the program.
8. The original attendance record was not kept at the program for a period of one year.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-13-12 Pets

Code: The program is required to properly care for pets and prevent any threat to the safety or health of the children by the pet.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined pets at the program were not properly housed or cared for or posed a threat to the safety or health of the children as noted in number 6 below:

1. The animal's cage was dirty with feces.
2. The aquarium was unclean.
3. The litter box was dirty with feces.
4. A pet posed a threat to the safety of a child in that [].
5. A pet requiring a license did not have a current license.
6. Proper inoculation records were not on file at the program for a pet requiring inoculations.
7. Children were exposed to the pet's urine and/or feces.

Rule: 5101:2-13-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to provide an environment that protects the children in care from any items and conditions that may threaten their health, safety, and well-being.

Findings: Children in care shall be protected from any items and conditions which threaten their health, safety, and well being. During the inspection, it was determined that children were not protected from the following item(s) or condition(s) which may threaten their health, safety, or well being as noted in the following number 10 & 23 below:

1. Surge protectors/outlets did not have childproof receptacle covers;
2. Open pull cords that are not closed loop;
3. Toys or other items small enough to be swallowed were present in the space where infants and/or toddlers were in care;
4. Electrical/extension cords attached to an object that would not likely result in a severe injury if pulled;
5. Stacked chairs;
6. Telephone cords;
7. Stacked chairs;
8. Employee(s) purse(s);
9. Diaper bags;
10. Television not securely anchored;
11. Small or lightweight pieces of shelving units are not securely anchored to the wall;
12. Staff member stepped over a barrier/gate while holding a child;
13. Chipping or peeling paint;
14. An area rug did not have a nonskid backing;
15. An area rug presented a tripping hazard;
16. A floor surface was unsafe in that [];
17. No platform was provided for the sink or toilet;
18. The platform provided for the sink or toilet was not sturdy;
19. The platform provided for the sink or toilet posed a safety hazard in that [];
20. Emergency exits were blocked by the following furniture in that [];
21. A mercury thermometer was being used to take a child's temperature.
22. Methods of ventilation used did not provide protection from rodents, insects, or other hazards.
23. Other tool kit with screws, bolts, and nails was stored under the sink in the kitchen and accessible to children.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-13-13 Clean environment and equipment

Code: The program is required to follow the cleaning schedule for equipment.



Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program was not providing a clean and healthy environment, furniture, materials and equipment as required by Appendix A, as noted in number 29 below:

1. Item(s) soiled with blood or bodily fluids were not cleaned/sanitized immediately.
2. Blankets/sheets were not cleaned weekly, when soiled, or before use by another child.
3. Children's individual blankets and belongings were stored in an unsanitary manner.
4. Bottles, bottle caps, nipples and other equipment used for bottle feeding were not cleaned and sanitized in a dishwasher or by washing, rinsing, and boiling for one minute.
5. Carpets were not vacuumed weekly or cleaned when soiled.
6. Changing table/pad was not sanitized after each use or cleaned when visibly soiled.
7. Reusable cloths were not being washed daily or when visibly soiled.
8. Cots/Pads/Mats were not cleaned and sanitized before assigning to a different child, when used by a sick child, when soiled or at least every three months.
9. Cribs were not cleaned and sanitized monthly, or when soiled, or before use by another child.
10. Diaper Receptacles were not cleaned and sanitized daily or more frequently as needed to eliminate odor.
11. Dishes/Cups/Silverware were not cleaned and sanitized after each use.
12. Water Containers were not labeled with the child's name, or were not cleaned and sanitized before use again on another day.
13. Dress up clothes and hats (dramatic play) were not cleaned monthly or when soiled.
14. Floors were not cleaned weekly or when soiled.
15. The food prep area, including sinks, were not cleaned before and after preparing food (including bottle preparation) or between preparing raw or cooked food.
16. Potty chairs were not cleaned after each use, rinsed with water, cleaned and sanitized or contents were not emptied into a toilet.
17. Food tables, highchair trays were not cleaned before and after each use.
18. Tables used for play were not cleaned when visibly soiled or sanitized daily.
19. Toilet bowls were not cleaned when visibly soiled or sanitized weekly.
20. Toilet seat(s), handle(s) and hand washing sink(s) were not cleaned when visibly soiled or sanitized daily.
21. Mouthed toys were not cleaned and sanitized after each child's use.
22. Toys, other than those mouthed by children, were not cleaned monthly or when visibly soiled.
23. Washable furniture, including fabrics on infant equipment, were not cleaned weekly or when soiled.
24. Upholstered furniture was not steam cleaned when soiled.
25. Slip covers were not washed at least every six months or when soiled.
26. Wastebaskets/rinse buckets, including lids, were not being emptied daily or cleaned and sanitized when visibly soiled.
27. The manufacturer's directions for the cleaning product were not followed.
28. The solution used for sanitizing was not a commercial product registered by the United States Environmental Protection Agency as a sanitizer.
29. Other fridge was not cleaned as needed.

Furniture, materials and equipment must be maintained according to the cleaning and sanitizing schedule in Appendix A to this rule. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 03 Postings & Equipment

Rule: 5101:2-13-17 Materials and Equipment

Code: The program is required to provide equipment appropriate for the children in the program in sufficient quantities that all children can be actively involved. Play materials must be accessible to the children and arranged in an orderly manner.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that equipment, materials and furnishings provided for indoor and outdoor play did not meet the requirement of the rule as noted in number 5 below.

1. Equipment and materials were not varied and adequate to meet the developmental needs of the children.
2. Equipment and materials were not provided in a sufficient quantity that each child can be actively involved in an activity.
3. Play materials were not readily accessible to the children.
4. Play materials were not arranged in an orderly manner so that children have opportunities to select, remove and replace play materials with minimal assistance during the day.
5. Durable, child-sized or safely adapted furniture was not provided for children.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-13-16 Emergency Drills

Code: The program is required to complete and document the required drills.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the required drills were not completed for item number 2 below:

1. Monthly fire drills
2. Monthly weather emergency drills (March through September) (missing April & May 2023)
3. Emergency/lockdown drills in each quarter of the calendar year

Rule: 5101:2-13-22 Fluid Milk

Code: The program is to ensure that children are served age-appropriate fluid milk.



Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program did not have the type of milk on-site to ensure that all children were served age-appropriate fluid milk requirements. Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-13-22 Meals and Snacks

Code: The program is required to safely store food.

Findings: During this inspection, it was determined that food was not stored in a safe manner as noted in number 1 below:

1. The refrigerator did not maintain a temperature of 40 degrees Fahrenheit or below;
2. Milk was not refrigerated for approximately () minutes after being served;
3. Food was observed thawing on the counter;
4. Spoiled food was served to children.

Rule: 5101:2-13-14 Requirements for Field and Routine Trips

Code: The program is required to obtain written parental permission before leaving the premises and retain the forms for at least one year from the date of the trip. Routine trip permission forms must be updated annually.

Findings: In review of the program's records, it was determined that requirements for written permission from the parent/guardian for a field trip or routine trip were not met as listed in number(s) 1 & 9 below:

1. Written parental permission was not secured for field trips and/or routine trips off the premises.
2. The written permission was missing the child's name.
3. The written permission was missing the date(s) of the trip(s) (field trips only).
4. The written permission was missing the destination(s) of the trip(s).
5. The written permission was missing the departure and return time(s) of the trip(s) (field trips only).
6. The written permission was missing the signature of the parent.
7. The written permission was missing the date on which the permission was signed.
8. The written permission was missing a statement notifying parents how their child will be transported.
9. Permission forms for routine trips were not being updated annually.
10. Written parental permission forms for field trips and/or routine trips were not being maintained on file for at least one year from the date of the trip.

Rule: 5101:2-13-14 Vehicle Inspections

Code: The program is required to complete and document weekly vehicle inspections.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program had performed weekly inspections of vehicles used for transporting children. Please see numbers 6 & 7 below:

The weekly inspection needs to include the following:

1. A visual inspection of the tires for wear and tire pressure;
2. A visual inspection of headlights, taillights, signals, mirrors, wiper blades, and dash gauges;
3. An inspection for properly functioning child and driver restraints;
4. An inspection for properly functioning doors and windows;
5. An inspection for, and cleaning of, debris from the inside of the vehicle;
6. Other inspections were being post dated, need to complete inspections weekly per rule requirement.
7. Unable to inspect the vehicle as provider states that vehicle is in the shop for minor work.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-13-20 Crib and Playpen Requirements

Code: The program is required to have enough cribs/playpens for all infants in attendance who require them.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program had zero playpens and needed at least one. A crib or playpen must be provided if the program serves infants, unless the infant meets the criteria for sleeping on a cot or mat. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-13-07 Staff Records



Code: The provider is required to maintain current employee, child care staff members and resident records in the Ohio Professional Registry.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that employment records in the Ohio Professional Registry (OPR) were not created or maintained as noted in number(s) 1 below:

1. The provider had not created or updated their individual profile in the OPR. (add group and schedule)
2. The provider had not created or updated the program's organizational dashboard in the OPR.
3. At least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member had not created or updated their individual profile in the OPR.
4. At least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member had not created an employment record in the OPR for the program on or before the first day of employment, including date of hire.
5. At least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member had not updated changes to positions or roles in the OPR within five calendar days of the change.
6. The program's organizational dashboard in the OPR was not updated within five business days when at least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member's scheduled days and hours changed.
7. The program's organizational dashboard in the OPR was not updated within five business days when at least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member's group assignments changed, if applicable.
8. The program's organizational dashboard in the OPR was not updated with the employment end date within five business days when at least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member ended employment.
9. At least one resident over the age of eighteen had not created a profile and employment record for the family child care provider within five days of becoming a resident or turning eighteen.
10. The program's organizational dashboard in the OPR was not updated within five calendar days of a change in residency for at least one resident over the age of eighteen.

Rule: 5101:2-13-15 Child Medical and Enrollment Records

Code: The program is required to have a completed medical on file for each child.

Findings: In review of of the children's records, it was determined that completed medical statements were not on file, as required, for children listed on the JFS Children's Record Review For Child Care as indicated in number(s) 2, 4, & 8 below:

1. No medical was on file for at least one child
2. Medical(s) on file was not updated every 13 months
3. Medical(s) were missing child's name and date of birth
4. Medical(s) were missing the date of the medical examination
5. The date of the exam was more than 13 months prior to the date the form was signed



6. Medical(s) were missing a statement that the child has been examined and is in suitable condition for participation in group care
7. Medical(s) were missing the signature, business address and telephone number of the physician, physician's assistant(PA), advance practice nurse (APN) or certified nurse practitioner (CNP) who examined the child
8. Medical(s) were missing a record of immunizations the child has had specifying month, day and year
9. Medical(s) were missing a statement from the physician, PA, APN, or CNP that the child has been immunized or is in the process of being immunized against the diseases required by division 5104.014 of the Revised Code and found in appendix A to this rule
10. Medical(s) were missing a statement from the child's parent or guardian that he or she has declined to have the child immunized against the disease for reasons of conscience, including religious convictions
