Code: The program is required to have all surge protectors and outlets covered.

Allegation: There are broken outlets and missing outlet covers.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that a power surge protector did not have childproof receptacle covers in the plugs that were not being used. However, wall outlets in the program are child proof. The program must have safety covers on all electrical outlets, including power strips and surge protectors, which are within the reach of the children. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

Rule: 5101:2-12-16 Emergency Drills

Code: The program is required to complete fire drills, weather drills, and emergency/lockdown drills appropriately.

Allegation: Emergency drills are not being conducted.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the required drills were not completed for item number(s) 1 below in that the drills are talked about but actual drills are not being conducted:

1. Monthly fire drills.
2. Monthly weather emergency drills (March through September).
3. Emergency/lockdown drills in each quarter of the calendar year.
