Rule: 5101:2-13-04 Fire Inspections for Type A Homes

Code: The program is required to have fire approval for areas used for child care before using the space.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the program had not obtained written approval from the local fire safety inspector or the state fire marshal as noted in number 1 below:

- 1. The program had not been inspected and approved within 12 months from the date of the last fire approval and the request for the new inspection was not made at least 30 days prior to the expiration of the previous approval.
- 2. The fire approval had not been obtained due to violations which required re-inspection. The fire inspection had occurred more than 30 days ago, and the program has not corrected the violations and/or scheduled a re-inspection with the fire inspector.

Code: The program is required to have an adequate fall surface on the outdoor playground.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the playground did not have adequate fall surface under and around equipment as noted in the following number 1below:

- 1. No fall surface under the plastic slide outside.
- 2. Adequate fall surface to soften the impact of a fall
- 3. Other []



Any equipment designed for climbing, swinging, bouncing, or sliding needs a fall zone of protective material resilient under and around the equipment in order to protect children in the event of a fall. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes written verification of the discontinued use of this equipment until corrections are made along with a description of the resilient material added, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

The infant was wrapped in a blanket and had a pacifier strapped to them in the pack and play. Code: The program is required to provide an environment that protects the children in care from any items and conditions that may threaten their health, safety, and well-being.

Findings: Children in care shall be protected from any items and conditions which threaten their health, safety, and well being. During the inspection, it was determined that children were not protected from the following item which may threaten their health, safety, or well being as noted in the following number 8 below:

- 1. Surge protectors/outlets did not have childproof receptacle covers.
- 2. Open pull cords that are not closed loop.
- 3. Toys or other items small enough to be swallowed were present in the space where infants and/or toddlers were in care.
- 4. Electrical/extension cords attached to an object that would not likely result in a severe injury if pulled.
- 5. Stacked chairs.



- 6. Telephone cords.
- 7. Employee(s) purse(s).
- 8. Diaper bags. A diaper bag was observed sitting on the floor next to a car seat and accessible to children.
- 9. Television not securely anchored.
- 10. Small or lightweight pieces of shelving units are not securely anchored to the wall.
- 11. Staff member stepped over a barrier/gate while holding a child.
- 12. Chipping or peeling paint.
- 13. An area rug did not have a nonskid backing.
- 14. An area rug presented a tripping hazard.
- 15. A floor surface was unsafe in that [].
- 16. No platform was provided for the sink or toilet.
- 17. The platform provided for the sink or toilet was not sturdy.
- 18. The platform provided for the sink or toilet posed a safety hazard in that [].
- 19. Emergency exits were blocked by the following furniture in that [].
- 20. A mercury thermometer was being used to take a child's temperature.
- 21. Methods of ventilation used did not provide protection from rodents, insects, or other hazards.
- 22. Other [].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 04 Indoor/Outdoor Space

Rule: 5101:2-13-11 Outdoor Space

Code: The program staff is required to protect the children from hazardous conditions in the outdoor play area.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the following hazardous conditions existed in the outdoor play area, as noted in number 15 below:

- 1. There was broken glass.
- 2. There were tall weeds.
- 3. There was poison ivy.
- 4. There were tree branches.
- 5. There was mold visible.
- 6. The sandbox was contaminated.
- 7. There were thistles with prickers.
- 8. There were bird droppings.
- 9. The outdoor area was littered with trash.
- 10. The trash can was missing a lid.
- 11. The trash was not emptied from the day(s) before.
- 12. The trash can was overflowing with trash.
- 13. The trash can was infested with insects.
- 14. The trash can was visibly dirty.

15. Other. There were logs stacked against the garage and wooden pallets in the outdoor play area that could be hazardous.

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 11/18/2023

Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-13-16 First Aid Kit/Standard Precautions

Code: The program is required to meet the requirements for first aid kits.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program did not have a tooth preservation system or chilled milk in the first aid kit in the vehicle/ on a routine trip as required, that included all items listed in the appendix A of the rule. The kit were missing the item in number 8 below:

- 1. One roll of first-aid tape;
- 2. Individually wrapped sterile gauze;

squares in assorted sizes;

- 3. Sterile adhesive bandages in assorted sizes;
- 4.Tweezers:
- 5. Gauze rolled bandage;
- 6. Triangular bandage;
- 7. Rounded end scissors;
- 8. Tooth preservation system or fresh chilled liquid milk in which to transport a lost permanent tooth, including a written reference indicating location of the refrigerator/freezer where milk is stored if a tooth preservation system is not part of the first aid kit (for programs serving school age children only);
- A working digital thermometer;
- 10. Disposable non-latex gloves;
- 11. A working flashlight;
- 12. An instant cold pack that has not been activated or ice, including a written reference indicating location of the refrigerator/freezer where the ice is stored if an instant cold pack is not part of the first aid kit;
- 13. Sealable leak-proof plastic bags in assorted sizes or double bagged plastic bags that can be securely tied for materials soiled with blood or bodily fluids;
- 14. Pocket mask or face shield, appropriate; for all ages of children in care, for cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) administration;
- 15. Soap or waterless sanitizer (field trip or transporting away from the program only);
- 16. Bottled water (field trip or transporting away from the program only).

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-13-22 Meals and Snacks

Code: The program is required to provide appropriately sized food that does not pose a choking hazard.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that children were served grapes, which posed a choking hazard/was not appropriate for their age. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-13-16 Disaster Plan

Code: The program is required to train child care staff members and employees on the written disaster plan annually and keep written documentation of the training on-site.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the program's written disaster plan did not meet the requirement for training child care staff members and employees on the plan annually as noted in numbers 1, 2 below:

- 1. Child care staff members and employees were not trained annually.
- 2. Written documentation of the training was not kept on file.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-13-16 Disaster Plan

Code: The program is required to have a completed written disaster plan.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the program's written disaster plan did not meet the requirement or was missing the information in number 18 below:

Procedures:

- 1. The written disaster plan had not been completed
- 2. The plan was not provided to all child care staff and employees
- 3. Weather emergencies and natural disasters which include severe thunderstorms, tornadoes, flash flooding, major snowfall, blizzards, ice storms or earthquakes

- 4. Emergency outdoor and indoor lockdown or evacuation due to threats of violence which includes active shooter, bioterrorism or terrorism
- 5. Emergency or disaster evacuations due to hazardous materials and spills, gas leaks or bomb threats.
- 6. Outbreaks, epidemics or other infectious disease emergencies
- 7. Loss of power, water, or heat
- 8. Other threatening situations that may pose a health or safety hazard to the children in the program Details:
- 9. Shelter in place or evacuation, how the program will care for and account for the children until they can be reunited with the parent
- 10. Assisting infants and children with special needs and/or health conditions
- 11. Emergency contact information for parents and the program
- 12. Procedures for notifying and communicating with parents regarding the location of the children if evacuated
- 13. Procedures for communicating with parents during loss of communications, no phone or internet service available
- 14. The location of supplies and procedures for gathering necessary supplies for staff and children if required to shelter in place
- 15. What to do if a disaster occurs during the transport of children or when on a field trip or routine trip
- 16. Making the plan available to all child care staff members and employees
- 17. Training of staff or reassignment of staff duties as appropriate
- 18. Updating the plan on a yearly basis
- 19. Contact with local emergency management officials

Add the missing information to the disaster plan. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes the missing information, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Code: The program is required to retain and update infant feeding instructions.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that written instructions for feeding the infants noted on the Children Record Review form were not on file as required by this rule. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

- 1. The provider had not created or updated their individual profile in the OPR.
- 2. The provider had not created or updated the program's organizational dashboard in the OPR.
- 3. At least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member had not created or updated their individual profile in the OPR.
- 4. At least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member had not created an employment record in the OPR for the program on or before the first day of employment, including date of hire.
- 5. At least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member had not updated changes to positions or roles in the OPR within five calendar days of the change.
- 6. The program's organizational dashboard in the OPR was not updated within five business days when at least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member's scheduled days and hours changed.
- 7. The program's organizational dashboard in the OPR was not updated within five business days when at least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member's group assignments changed, if applicable.
- 8. The program's organizational dashboard in the OPR was not updated with the employment end date within five business days when at least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member ended employment.
- 9. At least one resident over the age of eighteen had not created a profile and employment record for the family child care provider within five days of becoming a resident or turning eighteen.
- 10. The program's organizational dashboard in the OPR was not updated within five calendar days of a change in residency for at least one resident over the age of eighteen.

- 3. Child Abuse training was not completed within the first ninety days of hire.

Correct the violation and submit the documentation of current certification with the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.
