Rule: 5180:2-12-22 Meal and Snack Requirements

Code: The program is required to obtain signed and dated instructions from the parent if a child has a special diet.

Allegation: It was alleged that special diet instructions were not followed as required.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: The allegation is substantiated in that, during the inspection, it was determined that a special diet restricted food item was served to a child and the program did not follow the written, signed and dated instructions from the parents/guardians. Domain:07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5180:2-12-23 Infant Daily Care

Code: The program is required to provide a daily written record for each infant in care to the parents when picking up the infant each day.

Allegation: It was alleged that the infant daily record was not completed as required.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: The allegation is substantiated in that, during the inspection, it was determined that the written record used to document infant routines and activities did not meet the requirements as noted in number(s) 2 below:

1. A daily written record was not provided to the parent or person picking up the infant on a daily basis.
2. Food intake was missing.
3. Sleeping patterns was missing.
4. Times and results of diaper changes was missing.
5. Information about daily activities was missing.

Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is required at this time.

Moderate Risk Non-Compliances

Domain:01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5180:2-12-18 Ratio

Code: The program is required to maintain the appropriate staff to child ratio for each group served.

Findings: During the inspection, a ratio of 1 child care staff member(s) for 8 children was determined to have occurred for the Discover Preschool group which included three children less than 30 months of age, when the situation in number(s) 7 below occurred:

1. A child care staff member stepped out of the room.
2. A child care staff member had not arrived at work on time.
3. Children were present who were not scheduled to be there.
4. A child care staff member was unable to work.
5. A child was injured in that group.
6. A child arrived in the group before a second staff member was scheduled to arrive with the group.
7. The program did not follow the ratio for the youngest child in the group.
8. A child was transitioning to the next older age group, and the program did not follow the ratio for the youngest child in the group.
9. Ratio was doubled for more than two hours while children were napping.
10. Ratio was doubled while children were napping for a group that included at least one infant.
11. Ratio was doubled while children were napping and there were not enough staff members in the building to meet staff/child ratio.
12. Ratio was doubled in the school age group to allow access to the program, however, the program does not serve only school age children.
13. Both child care staff members did not have a working communication device when one staff member left the group to allow access to the school age only program.
14. The child care staff member did not return to the group after allowing access to the school age only program.

Additional child care staff members must be hired or current child care staff members must be rescheduled to maintain compliance. Provide staff training. Low Risk Non-Compliances

Domain:01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5180:2-12-19 Supervision

Code: The program staff is required to supervise children in their assigned group by sight and hearing. Supervision includes being near enough to respond and reach children immediately including responding to the child's basic needs and protecting them from harm.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that children were not being properly supervised as noted in number(s) 4 below:

1. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during indoor play.
2. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during outdoor play.
3. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member more than once.
4. Staff were not physically present in the space and near enough to respond and reach the child(ren) immediately in that the only infant teacher in the room was rocking an infant in the crib area behind a closed gate while two infants were in the play area on the other side of the gate.

Children must be supervised according to rule and within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member at all times. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
