# **Complaint Allegations**

If a program disagrees with a licensing finding, the program may request a review of the finding(s). Ohio Administrative Code 5101:2-12-03 and 5101:2-13-03 detail the process for submitting a request for review. The request for review must be submitted within seven business days from the receipt of the licensing report. In addition, if the program is star rated, the rating may be impacted if a serious or moderate risk non-compliance is cited.

### Domain:02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-13 Sanitary Equipment and Environment Code: The program is required to follow the cleaning schedule for equipment.

Allegation: Infants have been observed being served food from the same container using the same spoon.

**Determination:** Substantiated

Findings: The allegation that children were served from the same container was denied. However, during the inspection, it was determined that the program was not providing a clean and healthy environment, furniture, materials and equipment as required by Appendix A, as noted in number 11 below:

1. Item(s) soiled with blood or bodily fluids were not cleaned/sanitized immediately.

2. Blankets/sheets were not cleaned weekly, when soiled, or before use by another child.

3. Children's individual blankets and belongings were stored in an unsanitary manner.

4. Bottles, bottle caps, nipples and other equipment used for bottle feeding were not cleaned and sanitized in a dishwasher or by washing, rinsing, and boiling for one minute.

5. Carpets were not vacuumed weekly or cleaned when soiled.

6. Changing table/pad was not sanitized after each use or cleaned when visibly soiled.

7. Reusable cloths were not being washed daily or when visibly soiled.

8. Cots/Pads/Mats were not cleaned and sanitized before assigning to a different child, when used by a sick child, when soiled

or at least every three months.

9. Cribs were not cleaned and sanitized monthly, or when soiled, or before use by another child.

10. Diaper Receptables were not cleaned and sanitized daily or more frequently as needed to eliminate odor.

11. Dishes/Cups/Silverware were not cleaned and sanitized after each use.

12. Water Containers were not labeled with the child's name, or were not cleaned and sanitized before use again on another day.

13. Dividers were not cleaned when visibly soiled.

14. Dress up clothes and hats (dramatic play) were not cleaned monthly or when soiled.

15. Floors were not cleaned weekly or when soiled.

16. The food prep area, including sinks, were not cleaned before and after preparing food (including bottle preparation) or between preparing raw or cooked food.

17. Potty chairs were not cleaned after each use, rinsed with water, cleaned and sanitized or contents were not emptied into a toilet.

18. Food tables, highchair trays were not cleaned before and after each use.

19. Tables used for play were not cleaned when visibly soiled or sanitized daily.

20. Toilet bowls were not cleaned when visibly soiled or sanitized weekly.

21. Toilet seat(s), handle(s) and hand washing sink(s) were not cleaned when visibly soiled or sanitized daily.

22. Mouthed toys were not cleaned and sanitized after each child's use.

23. Toys, other than those mouthed by children, were not cleaned monthly or when visibly soiled.

24. Washable furniture, including fabrics on infant equipment, were not cleaned weekly or when soiled.

25. Upholstered furniture was not steam cleaned when soiled.

26. Slip covers were not washed at least every six months or when soiled.

27. Wastebaskets/rinse buckets, including lids, were not being emptied daily or cleaned and sanitized when visibly soiled.

28. The manufacturer's directions for the cleaning product were not followed.

29. The solution used for sanitizing was not a commercial product registered by the United States Environmental Protection Agency as a sanitizer.

## Domain:05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-12-22 Meal and Snack Requirements

Code: The program is required to provide food that does not pose as a choking hazard and is appropriate for the age of the children.

Allegation: Infants were observed eating foods that were a choking hazard.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the infants were was served a food item that was a choking hazard. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is required at this time.

# Domain:07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-12-23 Infant Daily Care

Code: The program is required to provide infant daily care that meets the requirements of the rule.

Allegation: Children in the Infant 1 Room are fed sitting on the floor. High chairs are not always used for feeding food.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program's infant daily care did not meet the requirements of this rule as noted in number 4 below:

Infants could not safely and comfortably sit, crawl, toddle, or walk and play according to the infant's stage of development.
Infants were not removed from the crib, swing, infant seat, exercise seat or other equipment throughout the day for individual attention.

3. Each non-crawling infant was not provided the opportunity for tummy time, outside of their crib, each day.

4. Other: high chairs are not always provided for feeding children in the Infant 1 Room. children have been fed while sitting on the floor.

Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

### Domain:07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-12-23 Infant Bottle and Food Preparation Code: The program staff is required to serve formula to the identified infant labeled on the bottle.

Allegation: An infant was served the wrong formula.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that an infant was served formula provided by the program instead of the formula provided by the parent. The program must ensure there is a system in place to serve the correct formula to the correct infant. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is required at this time.

## Low Risk Non-Compliances

#### Domain:05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-12-22 Fluid Milk Requirements

Code: The program is required to serve age-appropriate fluid milk or obtain written documentation when serving substitutions for fluid milk.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that required documentation for substitutions for fluid milk was not on file as noted in number 4 below:

1. Written instructions from a licensed physician, physician's assistant, or certified nurse practitioner when infants up to 12 months of age are served anything other than formula or breast milk.

2. Written instructions from a licensed physician, physician's assistant, or certified nurse practitioner when infants and toddlers 12 months of age up to 24 months of age are served anything other than unflavored whole homogenized vitamin D fortified cow's milk, breast milk, or non-cow milk substitution that is nutritionally equivalent to milk.

3. Written instructions from a licensed physician, physician's assistant, or certified nurse practitioner when toddlers and children 24 months of age and older are served anything other than unflavored one per cent milk that is vitamin A and D fortified, unflavored fat free or skim milk that is vitamin A and D fortified, or non-cow milk substitutions that are nutritionally equivalent to milk.

4. Written parental consent for non-cow milk substitutions that are nutritionally equivalent to milk for children 12 months of age and older.

5. The program did not have the type of milk on-site to ensure that all children were served age-appropriate fluid milk.

Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.

#### Domain:07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-12-20 Cribs

Code: The program is required to provide enough cribs for all infants in attendance who require a crib.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program had 11 cribs in the Infant 1 Room and needed 12. A crib must be provided for all infants in attendance, unless the infant meets the criteria for sleeping on a cot or mat. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is required at this time.

#### Domain:07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-12-20 Cribs

Code: The program is required to space cribs two feet apart when in use.



Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that cribs in the Infant 1 Room were not two feet apart when in use, as required by this rule. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is required at this time.
