Complaint Allegations

Code: The program is required to maintain the appropriate staff to child ratio for each group served.

Allegation: The complainant alleged that ratios are not being followed during nap

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, required staff/child ratios were not maintained for the same group on multiple occasions, as noted below:

The ratio determined for the infant and toddler groups was 1 Child Care Staff Member(s) for 10 children when a teacher left the group to answer the door. Additionally, a ratio of 1 Child Care Staff Member(s) for 6 children (with children under 12 months) was determined for the infant group.

Additional staff members must be hired or current Child Care Staff Members must be rescheduled to maintain compliance. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5180:2-12-19 Supervision

Code: The program staff is required to supervise children in their assigned group by sight and hearing. Supervision includes being near enough to respond and reach children immediately and protecting them from harm.

Allegation: The complainant alleged that supervision was absent for a group of children while inside the building

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that children were left unattended while inside the program as noted in number(s) 1 below:

- 1. Child(ren) were left unattended once. (a child infant/young toddler age left the classroom and was walking down the hall unattended)
- 2. Child(ren) were left unattended more than once.
- 3. Child(ren) left the group and were unattended.
- 4. Child care staff were using a baby monitor to supervise children.
- 5. Child care staff were using a walkie talkie to supervise children.
- 6. Child care staff were using mirrors to view children in another room.
- 7. Child care staff were using a video camera instead of physically being present in the room.
