# **Moderate Risk Non-Compliances**

Domain: 01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5101:2-12-18 Ratio

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to maintain the appropriate staff to child ratio for each group served.



<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, a ratio of 1 child care staff member for 12 children was determined to have occurred for the mixed group of toddlers, preschoolers and school-agers when the situation in number 1 below occurred:

- 1. A child care staff member stepped out of the room.
- 2. A child care staff member had not arrived at work on time.
- 3. Children were present who were not scheduled to be there.
- 4. A child care staff member was unable to work.
- 5. A child was injured in that group.
- 6. A child arrived in the group before a second staff member was scheduled to arrive with the group.
- 7. Two groups were combined, and the program did not follow the ratio for the youngest child in the group.
- 8. A child was transitioning to the next older age group, and the program did not follow the ratio for the youngest child in the group.
- 9. Ratio was doubled for more than two hours while children were napping.
- 10. Ratio was doubled while children were napping for a group that included at least one infant.
- 11. Ratio was doubled while children were napping and there were not enough staff members in the building to meet staff/child ratio.
- 12. Ratio was doubled in the school age group to allow access to the program, however, the program does not serve only school age children.
- 13. Both child care staff members did not have a working communication device when one staff member left the group to allow access to the school age only program.
- 14. The child care staff member did not return to the group after allowing access to the school age only program.
- 15. Other [ ].

Additional child care staff members must be hired or current child care staff members must be rescheduled to maintain compliance. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-25 Medication Administration

<u>Code</u>: The program staff is required to administer medication following the instructions on the JFS 01217

"Request for Administrator of Medication for Child Care" form or attached prescription label.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined the program had administered medication to a child and the written instructions on the JFS 01217 "Request for Administration of Medication for Child Care" form or attached prescription label were not followed as noted in numbers 4, 5 & 6 below:

- 1. Medication had been administered to a child at the center at a different time than directed.
- 2. Medication was administered to a child for a longer or shorter period of time than directed.
- 3. The dose administered did not match the dosage required by the manufacturer's directions.



- 4. The dose administered did not match the dosage required by the written physician's instructions or the prescription label.
- 5. A child was administered the wrong medication provided to the program for that child.
- 6. A prescription label was not attached to the prescription medication.

Provide training to the staff designated to administer medication that the parent's and physician's instructions on the prescribed form, as well as instructions on the prescription label, must be followed to avoid over or under medicating a child. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-15 Medical/Physical Care Plans

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to have a completed JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan for Child Care" on file at the program for any child having a health condition and must implement and/or follow instructions on the plan. The program is required to have staff trained to perform the procedures on the JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan for Child Care" present at the program when the child requiring the procedure is onsite. Only staff who have been trained shall be permitted to perform the procedures listed on the JFS 01236.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the children's records, it was determined the program did not meet the requirements for caring for at least one child, indicated on the Children Records Review, with a condition that requires a JFS 01236 "Child Medical/Physical Care Plan" as noted in numbers 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 39 & 44 below:

1. No plan was on file.

- 2. Child's name was missing.
- 3. Name of the condition was missing.
- 4. Indication if medication or medical food is required was missing.
- 5. Signs, symptoms or situations that require staff to take action were missing.
- 6. Activities, foods, environmental conditions to avoid were missing.
- 7. Training instructions for procedures for staff to follow were missing or incomplete.

- 8. Child's name was missing or not attached.
- 9. Child's date of birth was missing or not attached.
- 10. Child's weight was missing or not attached.
- 11. Name of the medication/medical food was missing or not attached.
- 12. Dosage of medication/medical food to be administered was missing or not attached.
- 13. Time for medication/medical food to be administered was missing or not attached.
- 14. Expiration date for medication/medical food was missing or not attached.
- 15. Symptoms that require staff to administer medication/medical food were missing or not attached.
- 16. Specific instructions to administer the medication/medical food were missing or not attached.
- 17. Actions to be taken if the symptoms do not subside were missing or not attached.
- 18. Physician's signature was missing or not attached.

19. The date of the physician's signature was missing or not attached.

- 20. Child's name was missing.
- 21. Instructions regarding emergency evacuation, if applicable, were missing.
- 22. Signature of parent granting permission to implement the plan and verifying training was missing.
- 23. Date of parent signature was missing.
- 24. Certified Professional Trainer information was missing.
- 25. Signature of certified professional who trained the program staff was missing, if parent was not the trainer.
- 26. Date of trainer signature was missing.
- 27. Printed name(s)of child care staff member(s) who have received instructions for care and/or have been trained to perform the procedure were missing.
- 28. Signature(s) of child care staff member(s) who have received instructions for care and/or have been trained to perform the procedure were missing.
- 29. Date of staff signature was missing.
- 30. Administrator/Provider signature was missing
- 31. Date of administrator/Provider was missing.

- 32. Child's name was missing.
- 33. Name of medication or medical food was missing or inaccurate.
- 34. Date the medication/medical food was administered was missing.
- 35. Time medication/medical food was administered was missing.
- 36. Dosage of medication/medical food that was administered was missing.
- 37. Signature of person administering medication/medical food was missing.
- 38. The plan was not followed or implemented.
- 39. The plan was not able to be implemented due to conflicting information.
- 40. None of the child care staff members trained in the procedures on the JFS 01236 were onsite when a child requiring the plan was present.
- 41. Child care staff members trained in the procedures on the JFS 01236 were not scheduled to be present the entire the time the child requiring the plan was onsite.
- 42. None of the child care staff members trained in the procedures on the JFS 01236 accompanied the child requiring the plan during a trip.
- 43. A child care staff member who had not been trained in the procedures on the JFS 01236 performed the procedure.
- 44. Medication listed in the procedures to follow was not onsite available to administer as instructed and alternate instructions for this situation were not included on the plan.

Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a copy of the completed JFS 01236, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

#### **Low Risk Non-Compliances**

Domain: 01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5101:2-12-18 Attendance Records

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to maintain a record of the arrival and departure of each child. The program is also required to retain the original attendance record at the center for a period of one year.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined the program did not meet the requirements for keeping an attendance record as listed in numbers 2, 4, 7 & 9 below:

- 1. No attendance record was being maintained.
- 2. The attendance record was not being consistently completed.
- 3. The record did not include the name of at least one child.
- 4. The record did not include the birth date of at least one child.
- 5. The record did not include the assigned group.
- 6. The record did not include the child's weekly schedule.
- 7. The record did not include the time (hours and minutes) of each child's arrival and departure to the program, including transportation by the program.
- 8. The original attendance record was not kept at the program for a period of one year.
- 9. The tracking method did not remain with the group at all times;

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

### Domain: 01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5101:2-12-19 Supervision

<u>Code</u>: The program staff is required to supervise children in their assigned group by sight and hearing. Supervision includes being near enough to respond and reach children immediately including responding to the child's basic needs and protecting them from harm.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that children were not being properly supervised as noted in number 3 below:

- 1. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during indoor play.
- 2. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member during outdoor play.
- 3. Child(ren) were not within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member more than once (infant and preschool rooms).
- 4. Staff were not physically present in the space and near enough to respond and reach the child(ren) immediately.

## 5. Other: [ ].

Children must be supervised according to rule and within both sight and hearing of a child care staff member at all times. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

## Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-12-13 Sanitary Equipment and Environment

Code: The program is required to provide equipment and materials that are easy to clean.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that at least one piece of equipment, furnishings, or material at the program was not constructed of materials to facilitate cleaning as noted in number 1 below:

- 1. The material had a tear.
- 2. The material was not washable.
- 3. The material was porous.
- 4. The surface was cracked.
- 5. The surface was repaired, but in a manner that still did not facilitate cleaning.
- 6. Other [ ].

Equipment, furnishings, and furniture shall be constructed of materials to facilitate cleaning. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is required at this time.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that items in number 8 below provided by the parents were not being sent home on a daily basis for cleaning, or cleaned and sanitized by the program, as required.

Rule: 5101:2-12-13 Handwashing Requirements

Code: The program is required to have all staff and children wash their hands as outlined in rule.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that handwashing requirements were not followed as listed in numbers 3, 5, 11 & 12 below, as required in rule.

- 1. At least one staff/child did not wash their hands upon arrival for the day.
- 2. At least one staff/child did not wash their hands prior to departure.
- 3. At least one staff did not wash their hands upon entry into a classroom.
- 4. At least one staff/child did not wash their hands after toileting or assisting a child with toileting.
- 5. At least one staff/child did not wash their hands after each diaper change or pull-up change.
- 6. At least one staff did not wash their hands after contact with bodily fluids or cleaning up spills or objects contaminated with bodily fluids.
- 7. At least one child did not wash their hands after contact with bodily fluids.
- 8. At least one child did not wash their hands after returning inside after outdoor play.
- 9. At least one staff did not wash their hands after cleaning or sanitizing or using any chemical products.
- 10. At least one staff/child did not wash their hands after handling pets, pet cages or other pet objects that have come in contact with the pet.
- 11. At least one staff did not wash their hands before eating, serving or preparing food or bottles or feeding a child.
- 12. At least one child did not wash their hands before eating or assisting with food preparation.
- 13. At least one staff did not wash their hands before and after completing a medical procedure or administering medication.
- 14. At least one child did not wash their hands after water activities.
- 15. At least one staff/child did not wash their hands when visibly soiled (must use soap and water).
- 16. Other [ ].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

#### Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-12-20 Cribs

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to provide cribs with mattresses in good condition and sheets that are not too large or too small for the crib.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that sheets, mattresses and/or mattress covers did not meet the rule requirement as noted in number 2 below:

- 1. At least one crib did not have a sheet.
- 2. At least one sheet was too large.
- 3. At least one sheet was too small.
- 4. At least one sheet was torn.
- 5. The mattress was not at least one and one-half inches thick.
- 6. The mattress was not firm.
- 7. There was space between the mattress and the sides and end panels of the crib which exceeded one and one-half inches.
- 8. The mattress cover was not waterproof.
- 9. The mattress cover was torn.
- 10. Other: [].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

### Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-12-23 Infant Daily Care

<u>Code</u>: The program is required to provide a daily written record for each infant in care to the parents when picking up the infant each day.

<u>Finding</u>: During the inspection, it was determined that the written record used to document infant routines and activities did not meet the requirements as noted in number 1 below:

- 1. A daily written record was not provided to the parent or person picking up the infant on a daily basis.
- 2. Food intake was missing.

- 3. Sleeping patterns was missing.
- 4. Times and results of diaper changes was missing.
- 5. Information about daily activities was missing.

Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is required at this time.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 02/04/2024

#### **Domain: 08 Staff Files**

Rule: 5101:2-12-08 Medical Statement

<u>Code</u>: The program staff's medical statements are required to be completed and on file at the program.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined that the medical statements for the employees listed on the Employee Record Chart did not meet the requirements as listed in number 1 below.

- 1. A medical statement was not on file for at least one employee;
- 2. The medical statement(s) on file did not have a date of examination within 12 months of the employee's first day of employment;
- 3. Date of examination was missing;
- 4. Signature, business address, or telephone number of the licensed physician, physician assistant, advanced practice nurse, certified midwife, or certified nurse practitioner who completed the examination was missing;
- 5. A statement was missing that verifies the employee is:
- a. Physically fit for employment in a program caring for children;
- b. Immunized against Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis (Tdap);
- c. Immunized against Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR);
- 6. Tuberculosis (TB) screening/test information was missing:
- a. Documentation of the screening process to determine if the employee resided in a country identified by the world health organization as having a high burden of TB and arrived in the United States within the five years preceding the date of application for employment.
- b. Results of a TB test for employees meeting both criteria in 6a.
- c. Results of additional testing for employees with a positive TB test.
- d. Written statement, signed by a representative of the TB control unit, that the employee's TB is no longer infectious or the individual is receiving a TB treatment regimen for employees with a positive TB test.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a copy of the completed employee medical statement, or TB results/documentation, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5101:2-12-08 Child Care Staff Member Educational Requirements

<u>Code</u>: The program staff is required to have educational verification on file at the program.

<u>Finding</u>: In review of the staff records, it was determined that verification of a high school education for the child care staff member(s) listed on the Employee Record Chart, did not meet the requirements as listed in number 1 below:

- 1. Verification of completion of a high school education was not on file.
- 2. Documentation was incomplete or not on file for a high school junior or senior who is enrolled in a career-technical program.
- 3. Documentation was not on file for a high school junior or senior who is also enrolled in a college credit program in child development or early childhood education.
- 4. Documentation was not on file for a high school junior or senior who is enrolled in a Child Development Associate (CDA) training program.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a copy of the education verification, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
