Rule: 5101:2-12-17 Materials and Equipment

Code: The program is required to have enough equipment for all children in care.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that equipment and materials in the following categories were not provided in sufficient quantities for children in the cafeteria which was being used as a classroom and all other classrooms were empty, as required: 1-10.

- 1. Art supplies (excludes infants)
- 2. Manipulative materials and equipment
- 3. Blocks
- 4. Science-nature equipment (excludes infants)
- 5. Language arts and auditory materials and equipment
- 6. Pretend or dramatic play materials
- 7. Music equipment
- 8. Transportation materials and equipment
- 9. Gross motor equipment
- 10. Sensory motor equipment
- 11. School age children were not provided sufficient equipment and materials in at least five of the first nine categories above.

Rule: 5101:2-12-17 Materials and Equipment

Code: The program is required to provide equipment appropriate for the children in the program in sufficient quantities that all children can be actively involved. Play materials must be accessible to the children and arranged in an orderly manner.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that equipment, materials and furnishings provided for indoor and outdoor play did not meet the requirement of the rule as noted in number(s) 1-5 below.

- 1. Equipment and materials were not varied and adequate to meet the developmental needs of the children.
- 2. Equipment and materials were not provided in a sufficient quantity that each child can be actively involved in an activity.
- 3. Play materials were not readily accessible to the children in the cafeteria which was being used as a classroom and all other classrooms were empty.
- 4. Play materials were not arranged in an orderly manner so that children have opportunities to select, remove and replace play materials with minimal assistance during the day in the cafeteria which was being used as a classroom and all other classrooms were empty.
- 5. Durable, child-sized or safely adapted furniture was not provided for children in the cafeteria which was being used as a classroom and all other classrooms were empty.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 07/07/2024

Domain:07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-12-20 Cribs

Code: The program is required to provide a safe and sufficient barrier to separate the play and sleeping space.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the barrier between the play and sleeping space did not meet the requirements as noted in number(s) 1 below:

- 1. No barrier had been provided in that all children were moved to the cafeteria for care where there was no barrier.
- 2. The barrier did not prevent the infants from entering the sleeping area.
- 3. The barrier was not safe.
- 4. The barrier was not sturdy.
- 5. The barrier impaired staff's ability to see and hear all sleeping infants in their cribs.
- 6. The barrier was inadequate.

Domain:07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-12-20 Cribs

Code: The program is required to provide enough cribs for all infants in attendance who require a crib.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program had 0 cribs and needed 1. A crib must be provided for all infants in attendance, unless the infant meets the criteria for sleeping on a cot or mat. Technical assistance was provided at the time of the inspection, and as discussed, please correct this rule noncompliance. A written response for this rule noncompliance is not required at this time.
