The ratio determined for the Preschool 1 group was 1 Child Care Staff Member(s) for 12 (1 under 18 months) children. Additionally, a ratio of 1 Child Care Staff Member(s) for 9 children was determined for the Toddler group.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the program did not meet the requirements for keeping an attendance record as listed in number 2 below:

- 1. No attendance record was being maintained.
- 2. The attendance record was not being consistently completed.
- 3. The record did not include the name of at least one child.
- 4. The record did not include the birth date of at least one child.
- 5. The record did not include the assigned group.
- 6. The record did not include the child's weekly schedule.
- 7. The record did not include the time (hours and minutes) of each child's arrival and departure to the program, including transportation by the program.
- 8. The original attendance record was not kept at the program for a period of one year.
