Rule: 5101:2-13-04 Building Inspections for Type A Homes



Code: The program is required to have a completed and current fire approval on file at the program.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the fire approval form submitted was incomplete in that the following numbers 2 and 3 below were missing information on the fire approval form.

- 1. Documented on letterhead or approved form from the state fire marshal or local fire safety inspector;
- 2. Name of program;
- 3. Address of program;
- 4. Name and/or signature for the individual who completed the inspection;
- 5. Certification number of the individual who completed the inspection;
- 6. Date of inspection;
- 7. Date of re-inspection (if applicable);
- 8. Any stipulations or limitations as described [].

Contact the state fire marshal or the local fire safety inspector and have the missing information completed. Submit a copy of the updated fire approval as part of the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Domain: 01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5101:2-13-18 Attendance

Code: The program is required to maintain a record of the arrival and departure of each child. The program is also required to retain the original attendance record at the program for a period of one year.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the program did not meet the requirements for keeping an attendance record as listed in numbers 1-8 below:

- 1. No attendance record was being maintained.
- 2. The attendance record was not being consistently completed.
- 3. The record did not include the name of at least one child.
- 4. The record did not include the birth date of at least one child.
- 5. The record did not include the assigned group.
- 6. The record did not include the child's weekly schedule.
- 7. The record did not include the time (hours and minutes) of each child's arrival and departure to the program, including transportation by the program.
- 8. The original attendance record was not kept at the program for a period of one year.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.



Corrective Action Plan Due: 01/10/2025

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-13-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to store cleaning and sanitizing supplies in a place that is inaccessible to children. Cleaning agents, aerosol cans and chemical substances must be stored in their original container or clearly labeled. School-age children may use cleaning supplies and equipment with adult supervision.

Findings: During the inspection, cleaning and sanitzing equipment and supplies were not stored properly. Comet was found to be accessible in the basement level of home where childcare is done.

Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that the potentially hazardous substance is no longer accessible to children and a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 01/10/2025

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5101:2-13-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to provide an environment that protects the children in care from any items and conditions that may threaten their health, safety, and well-being.

Findings: Children in care shall be protected from any items and conditions which threaten their health, safety, and well being. During the inspection, it was determined that surge protectors/outlets did not have childproof receptacle covers in basement near the child cubbies.

2nd exit was also blocked in the basement. Please ensure the garage is clear so it can be used as a second exit.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 03 Postings & Equipment

Rule: 5101:2-13-16 Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan



Code: The program is required to post the completed JFS 01242 "Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan for Child Care" and implement as required by rule.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the requirements for the JFS 01242 "Medical, Dental and General Emergency Plan" was missing page 2 of the posting.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 01/10/2025

Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-13-16 First Aid Kit/Standard Precautions

Code: The program is required to meet the requirements for first aid kits.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the programs first aid kit was missing a flashlight and sealable plastic bags.

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 01/10/2025

Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5101:2-13-16 Emergency Preparedness and Response Plan

Code: The program is required to have a completed emergency preparedness and response plan.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the program's written emergency preparedness and response plan was not on file. This is the new disaster plan, form number is JFS 1251.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes the missing information, if applicable, to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 01/10/2025

Domain: 05 Health & Safety



Rule: 5101:2-13-22 Meals and Snacks

Code: The program is required to safely store food.

Findings: During this inspection, it was determined the refrigerator did not maintain a temperature of 40 degrees Fahrenheit or below.

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 01/10/2025

Domain: 06 Program Information

Rule: 5101:2-13-14 Requirements for Field and Routine Trips

Code: The program is required to obtain written parental permission before leaving the premises and retain the forms for at least one year from the date of the trip. Routine trip permission forms must be updated annually.

Findings: In review of the program's records, it was determined that written parental permission was not secured for field trips and/or routine trips off the premises.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 01/10/2025

Domain: 06 Program Information

Rule: 5101:2-13-14 Vehicle Inspections

Code: The program is required to complete and document weekly vehicle inspections.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program had not performed/documented weekly inspections of vehicles used for transporting children. The weekly inspection needs to include the following:

- 1. A visual inspection of the tires for wear and tire pressure;
- 2. A visual inspection of headlights, taillights, signals, mirrors, wiper blades, and dash gauges;
- 3. An inspection for properly functioning child and driver restraints;
- 4. An inspection for properly functioning doors and windows;
- 5. An inspection for, and cleaning of, debris from the inside of the vehicle;
- 6. Other [].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 01/10/2025



Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5101:2-13-23 Infant Bottle and Food Preparation

Code: The program is required to retain and update infant feeding instructions.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that written instructions for feeding the infants noted on the Children Record Review form were not on file, as required by this rule. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 01/10/2025

Domain: 08 Staff Files

Rule: 5101:2-13-07 Provider Responsibilities

Code: The provider is required to maintain the required liability insurance or have a completed JFS 01933

"Liability Insurance Statement for Family Child Care Providers" on file for each child in care.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the provider did not have a completed JFS 01933 "Liability Insurance Statement for Family Child Care Providers" completed for each child in care. Correct the violation and submit proof of insurance with the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 01/10/2025

Domain: 08 Staff Files

Rule: 5101:2-13-07 Provider Responsibilities

Code: The provider is required to reside at the licensed location, not have additional activities or employment during the program's operating hours, be on-site at the program for at least 75 percent of the program's operating hours, and have hours of availability posted in a noticeable place.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the provider had not posted their hours of operation for the program.

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 01/10/2025



Domain: 09 Children's Files

Rule: 5101:2-13-15 Child Medical and Enrollment Records

Code: The program is required to have a completed medical on file for each child.

Findings: In review of of the children's records, it was determined that completed medical statements were not on file, as required. Grayson was missing a vaccination record. Amara was missing the JFS 1305 cover page and vaccination record.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

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Corrective Action Plan Due: 01/10/2025

Domain: 09 Children's Files

Rule: 5101:2-13-15 Child Medical and Enrollment Records

Code: The program is required to have a completed JFS 01234 "Child Enrollment and Health Information for Child Care" on file on the premises for each child.

Findings: In review of the children's records, it was determined the JFS 01234 "Child Enrollment and Health Information For Child Care", was either on the older form version, missing parent date, or the provider had not signed the form. The two new children present during inspection did not have an enrollment on file.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 01/10/2025

Domain: 10 Written Policies & Procedures

Rule: 5101:2-13 Written Policies and Procedures

Code: The program is required to have policies and procedures for all items listed in this rule.

Findings: On the day of the inspection, the program's written policies and procedures provided to the parents/guardians and employees was missing item numbers 8 and 15 below:

General Information

- 1. Name, address, email address and telephone number.
- 2. Description of the provider's program philosophy.
- 3. Days and hours of operation, scheduled closings and basic daily schedule.
- 4. Staff/child ratios and group size.



- 5. Opportunities for parent involvement in activities.
- 6. Opportunities for parents to meet with the provider regarding their child.
- 7. Payment schedule, overtime charges and registration fees if applicable.
- 8. Programs shall have a policy in place describing supports for onsite breastfeeding or pumping for mothers who wish to do so (if the program serves infants or toddlers).

Provider Policies and Procedures

- 9. Enrollment including required enrollment information.
- 10. Care of children without immunizations.
- 11. Attendance including procedures for arrival and departure, the program's absent day policy, releasing child to persons other than the parent, releasing a child according to a custody agreement and follow up when a child scheduled to arrive from another program or activity does not arrive.
- 12. Supervision of children, including a separate supervision policy for school-age children, if applicable.
- 13. Child guidance.
- 14. Suspension and expulsion.
- 15. Ensure compliance with the Americans and Disabilities (ADA) including administering medication to children with disabilities and administering care procedures for children with disabilities.
- 16. Outdoor play, including limitations placed on outdoor play due to weather or safety issues (considerations may include but are not limited to temperature, humidity, wind chill, ozone levels, pollen count, lightning, rain or ice).
- 17. Food and dietary policy, including information regarding meeting one-third of the child's recommended daily dietary allowance, policy regarding formula, breast milk, meals, and snacks and policy on providing supplemental food
- 18. Management of illness including isolation precautions, symptoms for discharge and return, notification of parent of ill child and whether or not the provider will care for sick children.
- 19. Summary of procedures taken in the event of an emergency, serious illness or injury.
- 20. Administration of medication and topical products policy, medical foods, modified diets, and whether school age children are permitted to carry their own medical and ointments.
- 21. Transportation policy for field trips, routine walks, if applicable, and emergencies including if the provider will provide child care services to children whose parents refuse to grant consent for transportation to the source of emergency treatment.
- 22. Water activities/swimming.
- 23. Infant care, if applicable, including feeding, frequency of diaper checks, and information about daily activities.
- 24. Sleeping, napping and resting.
- 25. Evening and overnight care, if applicable.
- 26. Policy on hours of operation, closing due to weather, school delays or closings and any other factors.
- 27. Use of a substitute child care staff member or child care staff member pursuant to 5101:2-13-08 of the Administrative Code for sick days, vacations or other time off.
- 28. Situations that may require disenrollment of a child, if applicable.
- 29. Problem or issue resolution for parents or employees to follow when needing assistance in resolving problems related to the family child care home.
- 30. Formal screenings and assessments conducted on enrolled children and if the program reports child level data to ODJFS pursuant to Chapter 5101:2-17 of the Administrative Code.

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.
