Allegation: The program did not maintain the appropriate staff to child ratio for each group served.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection it was determined that required staff/child ratios were not maintained for different groups on multiple occasions.

Additional staff members must be hired, or current Child Care Staff Members must be rescheduled to maintain compliance. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5180:2-12-23 Infant Daily Care

Code: The program is required to provide infant daily care that meets the requirements of the rule.

Allegation: The program did not provide infant daily care that meets the requirements of the rule.

Determination: Substantiated

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program's infant daily care did not meet the requirements of this rule as noted in numbers 1 and 2 below:

1. Infants could not safely and comfortably sit, crawl, toddle, or walk and play according to the infant's stage of development.
2. Infants were not removed from the crib, swing, infant seat, exercise seat or other equipment throughout the day for individual attention.
3. Each non-crawling infant was not provided the opportunity for tummy time, outside of their crib, each day.

Moderate Risk Non-Compliances

Domain:07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5180:2-12-20 Cribs

Code: The program staff is required to remove any items listed in rule that are a potential suffocation risk from cribs.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that a child had been placed in a crib with an object that created a potential strangulation or suffocation risk, as indicated in numbers 4 and 12 below:

1. Bib
2. Pacifier clip/ribbon
3. Teething jewelry
4. Blanket for infant under twelve months old
5. Pillow
6. Boppy
7. Bumper pad
8. Clothing stored in the crib
9. Diaper bag
10. Object or toy strung over the crib in which a child can pull himself up
11. Stuffed animal that is large/soft enough to conform to the shape of the child's face
12. Other: Sound machine in crib

The rule prohibits any item which obstructs child-care staff's visibility or poses a risk of strangulation or suffocation from being placed on or in a crib. Remove the item(s) immediately. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.
