4. The provider did not have hours of availability to meet with parents a noticeable location.

Domain: 00 License & Approvals

Rule: 5180:2-13-03 Inspection Requirements

Code: The provider is required to refrain from falsifying information.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the provider provided false information, in that Provider reported that they live in the home and run the daycare out of the home. When investigator went in the the home it was clear children have not been present due to the large bags of items and the toys packed up, chairs stacked up on the table. Provider reported that the address on his drivers license is not his current address when her renewed it on 5/25, but when investigator went to the address on his drivers license there was a D. Gibson written on the mail box that matches his drivers license. Investigator called the Providers phone and a women answered reporting they were at the park, and The reported was not with them, when staff arrived the provider was with them and they had groceries. When the Provider was asked who the daycare kids are provider could not tell us the names of the children, a staff member had too. Yentel Jackson Reported to investigator she is not longer working for the provider who she couldn't tell us his name. When provider came he acted like he had never heard of the information till then. Rule 5180:2-13-03 requires the program to notify parents when a serious risk non-compliance is cited. The notification must inform parents of the serious risk non-compliance and include the Department of Children and Youth website and location of further information regarding the determination. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Code: The program is required to have firearms and ammunition secured.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined there were [weapons/firearms/ammunition] on the premises of the program when children were present, as noted in number 1 below:

1. [Weapons/firearms/ammunition] were on the premises of the program and were accessible to children and not secured as required.
2. Concealed handgun was not secured by the individual owning the concealed carry permit;
3. Individual owning a concealed carry permit had possession of a concealed handgun that was accessible to children;
4. Individual did not have valid military identification and documentation of successful completion of firearms training;
5. Law Enforcement.

Code: The program is required to only provide child care for children in spaces that are approved by the county agency prior to use.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the program was using space for child care in a manner that was not inspected and approved by the the county agency as noted in number 1below:

1. The children were up stairs in the rooms and or space was not approved prior to use.
2. The program did not notify the county agency in OCLQS prior to utilizing or structurally modifying any space not previously inspected.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Code: The program is required to refrain from blocking escape routes.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the program's primary escape route was blocked. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Code: The program is required to monitor the number of children in care to remain within the licensed capacity.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined there were 10 children in care during the hours of operation, which is over the capacity listed on the license. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5180:2-13-19 Supervision

Code: The program is required to appropriately supervise school age children.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that a school-age child/children were unattended outdoors and the following as noted in the number 1 below were not met:

1. The school-age children were not within sight or hearing of the provider or child care staff member.
2. The school-age children were engaged in higher risk activities.
3. The provider or child care staff member were not always able to intervene in needed.

Submit the program's corrective action place to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5180:2-13-19 Supervision

Code: The program is required to supervise children.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that children were left unattended and not supervised, in that a one year old was left in the home while all the adults were out side leaving the child not within sight or hearing. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5180:2-13-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to protect children from any items and conditions which threaten their health, safety, and well-being.

Findings: Children in care shall be protected from any items and conditions which threaten their health, safety, and well-being. During the inspection, it was determined the program did not protect children from an unsafe item or condition or equipment due to the following number 4 below:

1. Pull cord(s) on the window blind(s).
2. Extension cord(s); electrical cord(s) attached to an object that could result in a severe injury if pulled.
3. Stacked tables.
4. Folding tables.
5. Matches and/or a lighter.
6. Power tool(s).
7. Live wires.
8. Stove(s) that are either on or able to be turned on by a child.
9. Asbestos.
10. Traffic.
11. A body of water.
12. A well.
13. Environmental hazard(s) confirmed by local authorities having jurisdiction over the hazard.
14. A crockpot used to heat bottles.
15. Immediate access to a knife.
16. Large or heavy pieces of shelving units are not securely anchored to the wall.
17. Marijuana was accessible to children.
18. Other

Any hazardous equipment must be removed, replaced, or repaired and any hazardous condition must be corrected and must be made inaccessible to children. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that the item or condition has been removed and a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Code: The provider is required to keep their information current in OCLQS.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the information in number 4 below was not up to date in the Ohio Child Care Licensing and Quality System:

3. Email Address;
4. Days and Hours of Operation;
5. Services Offered;
6. Name of Program, If applicable.
7. Private pay rates.

Rule: 5180:2-13-18 Attendance

Code: The program is required to maintain a record of the arrival and departure of each child. The program is also required to retain the original attendance record at the program for a period of one year.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the program did not meet the requirements for keeping an attendance record as listed in number 1 below:

1. No attendance record was being maintained.
2. The attendance record was not being consistently completed.
3. The record did not include the name of at least one child.
4. The record did not include the birth date of at least one child.
5. The record did not include the assigned group.
6. The record did not include the child's weekly schedule.
7. The record did not include the time (hours and minutes) of each child's arrival and departure to the program, including transportation by the program.
8. The original attendance record was not kept at the program for a period of one year.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5180:2-13-18 Group Size and Ratios

Code: The program is required to follow ratio requirements.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that children were being supervised by an individual who did not meet the requirements of a child care staff member. Additional child care staff members must be hired or current child care staff members must be rescheduled to maintain compliance. Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5180:2-13-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to provide an environment that protects the children in care from any items and conditions that may threaten their health, safety, and well-being.

Findings: Children in care shall be protected from any items and conditions which threaten their health, safety, and well being. During the inspection, it was determined that children were not protected from the following item(s) or condition(s) which may threaten their health, safety, or well being as noted in the following number 5 below:

1. Surge protectors/outlets did not have childproof receptacle covers.
2. Open pull cords that are not closed loop.
3. Toys or other items small enough to be swallowed were present in the space where infants and/or toddlers were in care.
4. Electrical/extension cords attached to an object that would not likely result in a severe injury if pulled.
5. Stacked chairs.
6. Telephone cords.
7. Employee(s) purse(s).
8. Diaper bags.
9. Television not securely anchored.
10. Small or lightweight pieces of shelving units are not securely anchored to the wall.
11. Staff member stepped over a barrier/gate while holding a child.
12. Chipping or peeling paint.
13. An area rug did not have a nonskid backing.
14. An area rug presented a tripping hazard.
15. A floor surface was unsafe in that [].
16. No platform was provided for the sink or toilet.
17. The platform provided for the sink or toilet was not sturdy.
18. The platform provided for the sink or toilet posed a safety hazard in that [].
19. Emergency exits were blocked by the following furniture in that [].
20. A mercury thermometer was being used to take a child's temperature.
21. Methods of ventilation used did not provide protection from rodents, insects, or other hazards.
22. Other [].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5180:2-13-13 Clean environment and equipment

Code: The program is required to follow the cleaning schedule for equipment.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program was not providing a clean and healthy environment, furniture, materials and equipment as required by Appendix A, as noted in number 14 below:

1. Item(s) soiled with blood or bodily fluids were not cleaned/sanitized immediately.
2. Blankets/sheets were not cleaned weekly, when soiled, or before use by another child.
3. Children's individual blankets and belongings were stored in an unsanitary manner.
4. Bottles, bottle caps, nipples and other equipment used for bottle feeding were not cleaned and sanitized in a dishwasher or by washing, rinsing, and boiling for one minute.
5. Carpets were not vacuumed weekly or cleaned when soiled.
6. Changing table/pad was not sanitized after each use or cleaned when visibly soiled.
7. Reusable cloths were not being washed daily or when visibly soiled.
8. Cots/Pads/Mats were not cleaned and sanitized before assigning to a different child, when used by a sick child, when soiled or at least every three months.
9. Cribs were not cleaned and sanitized monthly, or when soiled, or before use by another child.
10. Diaper Receptacles were not cleaned and sanitized daily or more frequently as needed to eliminate odor.
11. Dishes/Cups/Silverware were not cleaned and sanitized after each use.
12. Water Containers were not labeled with the child's name, or were not cleaned and sanitized before use again on another day.
13. Dress up clothes and hats (dramatic play) were not cleaned monthly or when soiled.
14. Floors were not cleaned weekly or when soiled.
15. The food prep area, including sinks, were not cleaned before and after preparing food (including bottle preparation) or between preparing raw or cooked food.
16. Potty chairs were not cleaned after each use, rinsed with water, cleaned and sanitized or contents were not emptied into a toilet.
17. Food tables, highchair trays were not cleaned before and after each use.
18. Tables used for play were not cleaned when visibly soiled or sanitized daily.
19. Toilet bowls were not cleaned when visibly soiled or sanitized weekly.
20. Toilet seat(s), handle(s) and hand washing sink(s) were not cleaned when visibly soiled or sanitized daily.
21. Mouthed toys were not cleaned and sanitized after each child's use.
22. Toys, other than those mouthed by children, were not cleaned monthly or when visibly soiled.
23. Washable furniture, including fabrics on infant equipment, were not cleaned weekly or when soiled.
24. Upholstered furniture was not steam cleaned when soiled.
25. Slip covers were not washed at least every six months or when soiled.
26. Wastebaskets/rinse buckets, including lids, were not being emptied daily or cleaned and sanitized when visibly soiled.
27. The manufacturer's directions for the cleaning product were not followed.
28. The solution used for sanitizing was not a commercial product registered by the United States Environmental Protection Agency as a sanitizer.
29. Other [].

Furniture, materials and equipment must be maintained according to the cleaning and sanitizing schedule in Appendix A to this rule. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5180:2-13-14 Requirements for Field and Routine Trips

Code: The program is required to obtain written parental permission before leaving the premises and retain the forms for at least one year from the date of the trip. Routine trip permission forms must be updated annually.

Findings: In review of the program's records, it was determined that requirements for written permission from the parent/guardian for a field trip or routine trip were not met as listed in number 1, 10 below:

1. Written parental permission was not secured for field trips and/or routine trips off the premises.
2. The written permission was missing the child's name.
3. The written permission was missing the date(s) of the trip(s) (field trips only).
4. The written permission was missing the destination(s) of the trip(s).
5. The written permission was missing the departure and return time(s) of the trip(s) (field trips only).
6. The written permission was missing the signature of the parent.
7. The written permission was missing the date on which the permission was signed.
8. The written permission was missing a statement notifying parents how their child will be transported.
9. Permission forms for routine trips were not being updated annually.
10. Written parental permission forms for field trips and/or routine trips were not being maintained on file for at least one year from the date of the trip.
11. Other: [].

Domain: 06 Program Information

Rule: 5180:2-13-14 Requirements for Field and Routine Trips

Code: The program is required to have children on field and routine trips have identification on the child.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the children were not provided with any provider identification while on a field trip and/or routine trip. The identification must include the program's name, address, and a telephone number to contact in the event the child becomes lost. Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 07/16/2026

Domain: 06 Program Information

Rule: 5180:2-13-14 Requirements for Field and Routine Trips

Code: The program is required to have all required items on trips.

Findings: The following items need to be taken on routine trips and field trips:

1. First aid supplies;
2. JFS 01234 "Child Enrollment and Health information" (except routine walks);
3. A working cellular phone or other means of immediate communication (not to be used while a vehicle is in motion).

During the inspection, it was determined item number 1, 2 was missing. Submit the program's action plan to meet the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 07 Diapering & Infant Care

Rule: 5180:2-13-20 Crib and Playpen Requirements

Code: The program is required to refrain from using a crib that is assigned to a child for storage.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that a crib/playpen, assigned to a child, was used for storage. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 07/16/2026

Domain: 08 Staff Files

Rule: 5180:2-13-08 Child Care Staff Requirements

Code: The program is required to have staff complete the online staff orientation training. Additionally, the training must be completed before they are permitted to have sole responsibility of children.

Findings: In review of the staff records, it was determined that child care staff member(s) or substitute child care staff member(s) did not meet the requirements for completing the online orientation training as noted in number 4 below:

1. The training was not completed within 30 days of starting employment at the program as a child care staff member.
2. No documentation of completing the training after December 31, 2016.
3. Completion of the training was not verified in the OPR.
4. A child care staff member had sole responsibility of children and had not completed the online orientation.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5180:2-13-08 Child Care Staff Requirements

Code: The program staff is required to obtain the required trainings to meet the requirements.

Findings: In review of the staff records, it was determined the training requirements were not met for the Child Care Staff Member(s) listed on the Employee Record Chart, as required. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes copies of verification of training, to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 07/16/2026

Domain: 08 Staff Files

Rule: 5180:2-13-07 Provider Responsibilities

Code: The provider is required to reside at the licensed location, not have additional activities or employment during the program's operating hours, be on-site at the program for at least 75 percent of the program's operating hours, and have hours of availability posted in a noticeable place.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the provider was not meeting the following requirements as noted in number 2 below :

1. The provider no longer resides at the licensed location.
2. The licensed provider has additional activities/employment during operating hours, in that provider has job that he gets off at 2:00pm but has children tapped in before that time.
3. The provider was not on-site for 75 percent of the program's operating hours as required by this rule.
4. The provider did not have hours of availability to meet with parents a noticeable location.

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 07/16/2026

Rule: 5180:2-13-07 Staff Records

Code: The provider is required to maintain current employee, child care staff members and resident records in the Ohio Professional Registry.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that employment records in the Ohio Professional Registry (OPR) were not created or maintained as noted in number 9 below:

1. The provider had not created or updated their individual profile in the OPR.
2. The provider had not created or updated the program's organizational dashboard in the OPR.
3. At least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member had not created or updated their individual profile in the OPR.
4. At least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member had not created an employment record in the OPR for the program on or before the first day of employment, including date of hire.
5. At least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member had not updated changes to positions or roles in the OPR within five calendar days of the change.
6. The program's organizational dashboard in the OPR was not updated within five business days when at least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member's scheduled days and hours changed.
7. The program's organizational dashboard in the OPR was not updated within five business days when at least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member's group assignments changed, if applicable.
8. The program's organizational dashboard in the OPR was not updated with the employment end date within five business days when at least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member ended employment.
9. At least one resident over the age of eighteen had not created a profile and employment record for the family child care provider within five days of becoming a resident or turning eighteen.
10. The program's organizational dashboard in the OPR was not updated within five calendar days of a change in residency for at least one resident over the age of eighteen.
11. Other: []

Rule: 5180:2-13-08 Child Care Staff Requirements

Code: The program staff is required to have educational verification on file at the program.

Findings: In review of the staff records, it was determined that verification of a high school education for the child care staff member(s) listed on the Employee Record Chart, did not meet the requirements as listed in number 1 below:

1. Verification of completion of a high school education was not on file.
2. Documentation was not on file to verify that that a high school graduate was at least 16 years of age.
3. Documentation of a high school education was not on file for a person, counted in the staff/child ratio, and therefore was used as a Child Care Staff Member.

Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a copy of the education verification, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5180:2-13-10 Health Training

Code: Child care staff members and substitute child care staff members are required to complete health trainings within the first ninety days of hire and prior to being left alone with children.

Findings: In review of records, it was determined the CCSM or Substitute CCSM did not meet health training requirements listed in number 1 below:

1. All health trainings were not completed prior to being left alone with children.
2. First Aid training was not completed within the first ninety days of hire.
3. CPR training was not completed within the first ninety days of hire.
4. Communicable Disease training was not completed within the first ninety days of hire.
5. Child Abuse training was not completed within the first ninety days of hire.

Correct the violation and submit the documentation of current certification with the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Rule: 5180:2-13-15 Child Medical and Enrollment Records

Code: The program is required to have a completed JFS 01234 "Child Enrollment and Health Information for Child Care" on file on the premises for each child.

Findings: In review of the children's records, it was determined that information had not been secured from the parent/guardian on the JFS 01234 "Child Enrollment and Health Information For Child Care", as required, for the items in number 1 below:

1. No enrollment form was completed for at least one child
2. The current JFS 01234 was not completed for at least one child
3. Complete child information
4. Complete parent information
