Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5180:2-13-22 Meals and Snacks

Code: Meals and snacks provided are required to include all food groups and must include all of the

recommended daily dietary allowances as specified by the USDA.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that a meal or snack at the program did not meet the requirements as noted in number(s) 2 below:

- 1. The breakfast served did not include foods from three of the four good groups.
- 2. Snack served did not include foods from two of the four food groups.
- 3. The meal did not provide 1/3 of the recommended daily dietary allowances as specified by the USDA.
- 4. Juice used to meet the fruit or snack component was not 100% undiluted fruit or vegetable juice.
- 5. The meal served did not include an item from the meat or meat alternative group.
- 6. The meal served did not include an item from the bread or grain group.
- 7. The meal served did not include two items from the fruit/vegetable group.
- 8. The meal served did not include a vegetable (two fruits were served).
- 9. The meal served did not include a serving of fluid milk.

Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Low Risk Non-Compliances

Domain: 01 Ratio & Supervision

Rule: 5180:2-13-18 Attendance

Code: The program is required to maintain a record of the arrival and departure of each child. The program is also required to retain the original attendance record at the program for a period of one year.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program did not meet the requirements for keeping an attendance record as listed in number(s) 1 below:

- 1. No attendance record was being maintained.
- 2. The attendance record was not being consistently completed.
- 3. The record did not include the name of at least one child.
- 4. The record did not include the birth date of at least one child.
- 5. The record did not include the assigned group.
- 6. The record did not include the child's weekly schedule.
- 7. The record did not include the time (hours and minutes) of each child's arrival and departure to the program, including transportation by the program.
- 8. The original attendance record was not kept at the program for a period of one year.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 07/05/2025

Domain: 02 Safe & Sanitary Environment

Rule: 5180:2-13-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to store cleaning and sanitizing supplies in a place that is inaccessible to children. Cleaning agents, aerosol cans and chemical substances must be stored in their original container or clearly labeled. School-age children may use cleaning supplies and equipment with adult supervision.

Findings: During the inspection, cleaning and sanitizing equipment and supplies were not used or stored properly as noted in number(s) 1,4 below:

- 1. Cosmetics were accessible to children in the child care restroom area.
- 2. Disinfecting wipes were accessible to children in the [] area.
- 3. Fish food was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 4. Hand lotion was accessible to children in the childcare restroom area.
- 5. Hand sanitizer (for children under 24 months) was accessible to children in the [] area.



- 6. Laundry detergent was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 7. Powder dish washing soap was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 8. Paint cans were accessible to children in the [] area.
- 9. White out was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 10. Potting Soil was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 11. Other potentially hazardous substance [] was accessible to children in the [] area.
- 12. Cleaning/sanitizing supplies had not been clearly labeled.
- 13. School-age children were using cleaning supplies, agents and/or equipment without adult supervision.
- 14. A spray aerosol was used in the [] group while children were in attendance.
- 15. Other.

Provide staff training. Submit the program's corrective action plan, which includes a statement that the potentially hazardous substance is no longer accessible to children and a statement that training was provided, to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5180:2-13-12 Safe Environment

Code: The program is required to have running water below the temperature of 120 degrees Fahrenheit.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the water temperature was 125.0 in the following room: the childcare restroom. This temperature exceeds the requirement of remaining below 120 degrees Fahrenheit. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Rule: 5180:2-13-16 Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan

Code: The program is required to post the completed JFS 01242 "Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan for Child Care" and implement as required by rule.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined the requirements for the JFS 01242 "Medical, Dental and General Emergency Plan" were not followed as noted in number(s) 1 below:

- 1. The plan was not posted on each level of the home used for child care.
- 2. The name, address and telephone number of the program were not complete.
- 3. The location of the first aid kit, fire extinguisher and fire alarm system, fire alarm pull stations and electrical circuit box were not complete.
- 4. The telephone number for emergency squad, fire department hospital, poison control program, public children services agency, local health department, local emergency management agency and police department were not complete.



- 5. Location of children's records was not complete.
- 6. Emergency information including any medications or supplies needed i the event of an evacuation was not complete.
- 7. The current version of the prescribed form was not used.
- 8. The plan was not implemented when necessary in that [].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 03 Postings & Equipment

Rule: 5180:2-13-16 Medical, Dental, and General Emergency Plan

Code: The program is required to post the completed JFS 01201 "Dental First Aid" and implement as required by rule.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the JFS 01201 "Dental First Aid" was not completed. Correct the violation and submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 07/05/2025

Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5180:2-13-16 Communicable Diseases

Code: The program is required to post the Ohio Communicable Disease Chart in a noticeable area.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the Ohio Communicable Disease Chart was not posted as required, as indicated in number 2 below:

- 1. In a location readily available to the provider, child care staff members, employees, and residents;
- 2. The chart was not posted.
- 3. The posted chart was not the current version, and the Child Care Manual Procedural Letter No. 159 was not posted next to the chart.
- 4. The posted chart was not displayed in the size available in the ODJFS forms, central to be easily read.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 05 Health & Safety



Rule: 5180:2-13-22 Meals and Snacks

Code: The program is required to post the current menu in a noticeable location that is accessible to parents and note any substitutions at the time of the change.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program's weekly menu did not meet the requirement as noted in number(s) 1 below.

- 1. The menu was not posted.
- 2. The posted menu was not in a visible place readily accessible to parents.
- 3. The menu was not currently dated.
- 4. The entire menu was substituted.
- 5. At least one item on menu did not match what was served.
- 6. The meal or snack served did not match the posted menu.

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirement of the rule.

Corrective Action Plan Due: 07/05/2025

Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5180:2-13-16 Emergency Drills

Code: The program is required to complete and document the required drills.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the required drills were not completed for item number(s) 1 & 2 below:

- Monthly fire drills
- 2. Monthly weather emergency drills (March through September)
- 3. Emergency/lockdown drills in each quarter of the calendar year

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Domain: 05 Health & Safety

Rule: 5180:2-13-22 Fluid Milk

Code: The program is to ensure that children are served age-appropriate fluid milk.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program did not have the type of milk on-site to ensure that all children were served age-appropriate fluid milk requirements. Submit the program's corrective action plan to the Department to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5180:2-13-14 Vehicle Inspections

Code: The program is required to complete and document weekly vehicle inspections.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that the program had not performed or documented weekly inspections of vehicles used for transporting children. The weekly inspection needs to include the following:

- 1. A visual inspection of the tires for wear and tire pressure;
- 2. A visual inspection of headlights, taillights, signals, mirrors, wiper blades, and dash gauges;
- 3. An inspection for properly functioning child and driver restraints;
- 4. An inspection for properly functioning doors and windows;
- 5. An inspection for, and cleaning of, debris from the inside of the vehicle;
- 6. Other [].

Submit the program's corrective action plan to verify compliance with the requirements of this rule.

Rule: 5180:2-13-07 Staff Records

Code: The provider is required to maintain current employee, child care staff members and resident records in

the Ohio Professional Registry.

Findings: During the inspection, it was determined that employment records in the Ohio Professional Registry (OPR) were not created or maintained as noted in number(s) 10 below:

- 1. The provider had not created or updated their individual profile in the OPR.
- 2. The provider had not created or updated the program's organizational dashboard in the OPR.
- 3. At least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member had not created or updated their individual profile in the OPR.
- 4. At least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member had not created an employment record in the OPR for the program on or before the first day of employment, including date of hire.
- 5. At least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member had not updated changes to positions or roles in the OPR within five calendar days of the change.
- 6. The program's organizational dashboard in the OPR was not updated within five business days when at least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member's scheduled days and hours changed.
- 7. The program's organizational dashboard in the OPR was not updated within five business days when at least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member's group assignments changed, if applicable.
- 8. The program's organizational dashboard in the OPR was not updated with the employment end date within five business days when at least one employee, child care staff member, or substitute child care staff member ended employment.



- 9. At least one resident over the age of eighteen had not created a profile and employment record for the family child care provider within five days of becoming a resident or turning eighteen.
- 10. The program's organizational dashboard in the OPR was not updated within five calendar days of a change in residency for at least one resident over the age of eighteen.

- 8. Medical(s) were missing a record of immunizations the child has had specifying month, day and year
- 9. Medical(s) were missing a statement from the physician, PA, APN, or CNP that the child has been immunized or is in the process of being immunized against the diseases

10. Medical(s) were missing a statement from the child's parent or guardian that he or she has declined to have the child immunized against the disease for reasons of

conscience, including religious convictions
